Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Laird, the Reports of Actions Taken numbered II, III and IV listed under the report of the Vice President of Business and Finance were approved, ratified and confirmed.

The Vice President of Business and Finance presented the report of budget transfers for November, 1954, for the information of the Regents. (EXHIBIT C attached)

Regent Gelatt presented the report of the Educational Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Arveson, it was VOTED, That the following recommendations of the Educational Committee be adopted:

- 1. That Kenneth M. Watson, associate professor of physics, be granted leave of absence, without pay, for the second semester of 1954-55.
- 2. That Renato I. Rosaldo, associate professor of Spanish and Portuguese, be granted leave of absence, without pay, for the second semester of 1954-55.
- 3. That the request of Isaac F. Hall, professor of agricultural economics, to retire, effective December 31, 1954, be approved; and that he be granted emeritus status, to take effect on the same date.
- 4. That, effective July 1, 1955, the Ph.D. thesis fee be increased from \$15 to \$20.

Regent Jones presented the report of the Business and Finance Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the bequest of \$3000 by the late DeWitt S. Clark of Duluth, Minnesota, to the University of Wisconsin, to support cancer research at the University of Wisconsin, be accepted by The Regents of the University of Wisconsin in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Last Will and Testament of DeWitt S. Clark, Deceased; and that the Secretary or Assistant Secretary be authorized to accept and sign receipts for this bequest in the name of The Regents of the University of Wisconsin, and do all things necessary to effect the transfer of this bequest to the University of Wisconsin.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That \$37,000 be allotted from Federal contract overhead funds to complete the interior of the second floor of the Dairy Cattle Instruction and Research Center as authorized by the State Building Commission at a meeting on April 22, 1954.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That authority be granted to request the Governor to approve the transfer of \$2,635 from savings in the appropriation for the construction of Unit No. 2, Extension Division Building in Milwaukee, to provide funds for the installation of a dumb waiter in Unit No. 1, Extension Division Building in Milwaukee.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was VOTED, That the President and the Secretary be authorized to sign documents necessary to terminate the following easement: An easement for right of way over the easterly ten feet of Lot 12, Block 6, Brooks Addition to the City of Madison for the use and benefit of the owners and occupants of Lots 3 and 12, and right of way over a strip of land 10 feet in width off the North side of Lot 12, extending from the right of way along the East side 26 feet westerly for the benefit of the owners and occupants of the premises described as the westerly $16\frac{1}{2}$ feet of Lot 3 and the easterly 7.1 feet of Lot 4, and substitute therefor the following easement: An easement for right of way consisting of a strip fifteen feet in width off the North side of Lot 17, and fifteen feet in width off the North end of Lot 12, Block 6, Brooks Addition, for a distance of 36 feet westerly in length from the East lot line of said Lot 12.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Laird, it was VOTED, That, subject to the approval of the Governor, the offer of the Chicago and North Western Railway System to sell to the University a parcel of land containing approximately 2.55 acres adjoining the Marshfield Agricultural Experiment Station farm for a consideration of \$50 be accepted, and that the cost be charged to the appropriation of \$75,000 made by the State Building Commission for permanent improvements at the agricultural branch stations.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That operation of the East Hill Trailer Camp be continued for an additional year, through June 30, 1956.

President Werner read the following memorial to the late Herman L. Ekern, a former Regent of the University of Wisconsin;

"HERMAN L. EKERN

In Memoriam

- "We, the members of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin, record with deep sorrow the death of Herman L. Ekern, who served on this Board from 1939 until 1943.
- "Here was a man of great vision and courage, the highest principles, and a knack for getting good things done.
- "He came to this Board rich in governmental experience. He brought wisdom, tolerance, and good humor. Soft spoken and kindly, he was able to clarify issues and point up questions as few men could.
- "As President Fred has so well said: 'His was a gentle and courteous, but steadfastly unyielding voice when the interests of free education of the highest quality were concerned.'
- "When important issues were at stake, Herman Ekern took a thoughtful and determined stand. This quality sometimes led him into what appeared to be a minority position on the Board. But the weight of his logic, the soundness of his points, often changed opinions and made his position the final decision of the Board.
- "But as he swayed others with facts, he, too, had no fear of change when growing evidence pointed the way. It was not his habit to speak without considerable thought, and thus when he felt called upon to voice his opinions, the members of the Board were attentive to his words.
- "His service to the University as a regent was inestimable. But his service to the University continued unabated, even after he left the Board.
- "It is to the University's lasting credit that it bestowed upon him, in 1944 -- just a half-century after he had earned his Wisconsin Law degree -- the honorary degree, Doctor of Laws.
- "That was the year he was inducted into the Wisconsin Alumni Association's Half-Century Club, a group he met with and helped guide ever since. He was the sort of active alumnus the University relies heavily upon.
- "His devoted work as a director of the University of Wisconsin Foundation helped that organization become a strong support for the University.
- "In a long lifetime, crowded with a full range of services for his

fellow man, Herman Ekern always had time to help his Alma Mater. He saw in the University an agency which could raise men to higher ideals and greater deeds.

"His Alma Mater will forever honor the memory of this University of Wisconsin man."

Upon motion of President Werner, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, unanimously by a rising vote, that the above resolution in memory of the late Herman L. Ekern be adopted; that a copy be spread upon the minutes of this meeting; and that a copy of the resolution be sent to the family of Mr. Ekern.

At the request of Regent Wanvig, Regent Jones discussed the role of the Extension Division centers in the educational program of the University. He cited the educational opportunities the University has brought to the communities of the state through its extension centers. He stated that the situation in the Milwaukee Center, the largest extension center in the state, was unique - there is not only undergraduate work for two years but there is also a very extensive and effective graduate program with some 600 students participating in that graduate program; 1100 students enrolled in the day school and two or three times that number in the night school. He said that many young people in the surrounding counties will take advantage of educational opportunities in the facilities in Milwaukee if they are able to come to Milwaukee and if moves are made in the way of staff and development of program to take care of them. Regent Jones stated that he was sure the demand is here, that it will increase, and that it would be a great privilege for the State of Wisconsin to provide the program, staff and facilities for its citizens. He said the Regents had profited by their visit to the Milwaukee Center and were grateful to Dr. Parkinson and his staff for their fine spirit of hospitality and helpfulness.

Regent Laird stated that she had enjoyed as much as any her visit to Mil-waukee and would only reiterate that the work in the Extension Center and the State College is entirely different, and each of the institutions serves entirely different purposes.

Regent Wanvig stated that he and Regent Gelatt had discussed with Dr. Wim. F. Rasche, Director of the Wisconsin State Board of Vocational and Adult Education, Milwaukee, the possibility of utilizing some of their facilities for the Extension Division. He stated there may be something they can furnish the University to very good advantage at a minimum cost to the taxpayer. He said he had definitely made up his mind from studying the subject that there is an essential need for an institution of University standing, such as the University is operating in Milwaukee. He stated that from his experience in business he had the feeling that renting space for a permanent need is costly, uneconomical and inefficient: that he thought we have arrived at a point where we realize that with growing enrollment we should have a four-year course in Milwaukee and that we should provide adequate facilities. He said if that were to be the wish or the conclusion of the Legislature, he would think and hope that they would conclude that the operation should be under the University Board of Regents. Regent Wanvig stated there is a very pressing need immediately for a two-story building and an additional wing on the present buildings.

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Regent Wanvig then read the following statement and moved its adoption:

"The Regents have inspected the facilities of the Extension Division in Milwaukee and have observed that although space still is being rented and temporary barracks are being used, the facilities are crowded. The Regents are aware of the fact that enrollments are increasing and will continue to grow. Therefore, the Regents respectfully urge the Governor and the Legislature to appropriate, with the least possible delay, funds for the following additions to the Extension Division facilities in Milwaukee:

- (1) A two-story addition to Unit #2. Estimated cost \$400,000.
- (2) A six-story and basement wing abutting on the West end of Units #1 and #2. Estimated cost approximately \$1,713,600.

The motion was seconded by Regent Renk and Wasproved unanimously.

Vice President Baldwin called the attention of the Regents to Volume I of the final report of the Legislative Council which had been submitted to the Governor pursuant to Section 13.35(9), Wisconsin Statutes, copies of which had been distributed to the Regents. He stated that this document represented the work of the Council's University Policies Committee, which was created pursuant to the 1953 Legislature's Joint Resolution 31,5, and that in order that the results of their study may be made available to all citizens of the state, the Alumni Association will print the report in the January issue of "The Alumnus". The Regents were urged to read the report carefully.

President Werner stated that he wished to thank Directors Adolfson and Parkinson for their very kind and generous treatment given the Regents during their visit in Milwaukee.

President Werner stated that Regent Arveson had expressed the wish for a short recess for a meeting of the Special Regent Committee on the Medical School Deanship. Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the Regents recess.

The Regents reconvened at 12:55 P.M.

Regent Arveson reported that the Special Regent Committee on the Medical School Deanship has met several times, and while the Committee was not prepared to name their choice for the position of Dean of the Medical School at this time, their recommendation for the appointment of such a dean would be made at the January 8, 1955, meeting of the Regents, or earlier.

Upon motion of Regent Arveson, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the meeting adjourn.

The meeting adjourned at 12:57 P.M.
