U.S. Nears 'Shooting War' In Occupation of Iceland

Knox Hints 'Shooting Orders' for Navy; Soviets Stall Nazis

Events on both sides of the Atlantic hastened the United States' pace toward a "shooting war" with Germany during the last 24 hours. These developments, which overshadowed the bloody Russo-German war and reports that Soviet troops had stalled the Nazi offensive, included:

1. Navy Secretary Frank Knox implied, in connection with U. S. occupation of Iceland, that U. S. naval forces had been instructed by President Roosevelt that they may have to shoot to keep open vital North Atlantic sealanes.

PREDICTS COLLABORATION

2. Prime Minister Winston Churchill in London told a cheering house of commons that the American and British navies would "collaborate" in the vital battle of the Atlantic, and that British forces would remain in Iceland to help defend it.

3. Wendell Willkie, coming from a luncheon with the president, called for the establishment of American bases in northern Ireland or Scotland, if necessary, and approved the occupation of Iceland as the "first step in a series of similar steps that should shortly be taken."

CLAIM CHANNEL 'U. S. FRONT'

4. An authorized German spokesman in Berlin said that President Roosevelt had advanced the United States frontier to the English channel by sending American troops to Iceland, which he called an active military step outside the western hemisphere. The Nazis reiterated that Iceland was a theater of war included in the Axis counter-blockade zone and said the United States would have to "take the consequences."

Knox revealed at a press conference that the president as commander-in-chief had issued new orders to the navy, going "further" than original instructions which called only for the reporting of hostile craft in hemisphere waters. The secretary, who last week advocated the use of the navy now to "sweep the German menace from the seas," quoted from Mr. (Continued on page 16)

Henri Dentz, French commander at Beirut, had ignored the British ultimatum to surrender the city which expired at 5:30 a. m. Beirut time. BBC said British forces now are closing in on the Lebanese capital.

No Crack-Down On Labor, Asks Prof. Perlman

The handling of labor in critical situations cannot be successfully done by making a frontal attack on the situation, Prof. Selig Perlman, authority on labor problems and a member of the economics department here, told a capacity audience in the Memorial Union Play Circle last night.

He was to speak on the question "What Will Happen to Labor in the Event of War?" but rephrased his title to be "The American Labor Union Situation in the Shadow of War," and rather than make predictions as to what will happen to labor, gave information on how to handle the situation.

Mary Jane Purcell introduced the speaker and conducted the half-hour informal question period following the speech.

"I advocate a policy opposite from cracking down on labor because cracking down does not assure the desired results," Professor Perlman said. He suggested that the handling must be

And in case you haven't been watching the sky around 1 a. m. these past few nights, the northern lights or Aurora Borealis, have been especially beautiful.

Veteran Gets War Honor 23 Years After Armistice

Uncle Sam promised it to him 23 years ago, shortly after his outfit moved back from bloody Chateau-Thierry, and the wounds in his shoulder, forearm, and hand were still stiff.

IT CAME TUESDAY

But it was only Tuesday, July 8, 1941, that P. S. Schore finally opened a small box brought by the mailman, and found the coveted Purple Heart medal, given only to United States soldiers wounded in action.

For Schore, who during the past 15 years has been a custodian in the university's Bascom hall, World War memories aren't the easiest thing in the world to talk about. But he'll tell you that he was among the first transport loads of American regulars that went to France shortly after war was declared in 1917. He had enlisted

three months before we entered the conflict.

DOESN'T SAY MUCH


And he doesn't say much about Chateau-Thierry, except that he was among the machine gunners of the Fourth division which held back great German forces in that first great

Dr Kremers Passes At U Infirmary

The man who did most for the cause of pharmacy in the United States died here yesterday.

Prof. Edward Kremers, 76, dean of the Wisconsin School of Pharmacy for 43 years and a pioneer in pharmaceutical education, died of a sudden heart attack at 1 p. m. yesterday at the Wisconsin General hospital. He had been ill for some time, and had undergone several operations during the last months.

Funeral arrangements have not as yet been announced.

KNOWN WORLD-OVER

Author, editor, and historian, Dr. Kremers was known the world over for his research in pharmaceutical education.

"His work and encouragement has been an ever-present ideal for us to follow and his death will be a great loss for pharmacy," Dr. A. H. Uhl, present director of the Pharmacy school, said last night.

White-haired, a hard worker, Dr. Kremers was one of the two Wisconsin men awarded the Remington medal, highest award of organized pharmacy.

ALWAYS AT WORK

In a life-time of work, Dr. Kremers collected all available material on the history of pharmacy, and late in 1940 he published a complete text-book of progress in pharmacy.

"He was always working," Dr. Uhl said. "His only recreation was his home and his laboratory work."

Perhaps the greatest perpetuator of pharmaceutical education the world has known, Dr. Kremers did pioneer work in phytochemistry, volatile oils (Continued on page 16)

Scientific Marvels Displayed At Physics Department 'Museum'

See yourself as others see you, listen and learn how to detect submarines and other assorted sounds, watch upside down articles appear right side up, tell time by the motions of the earth, and find out how wireless waves are transmitted from sender to receiver.

You can do all this, in addition to viewing other unusual gadgets, instruments, and processes any afternoon, if you visit the "museum" of the university physics department crammed into a glass-walled room on the first floor of Sterling hall.

The museum is used by physics students in connection with their general laboratory work, and is open to the public every afternoon.

CLOCK COMES FIRST

First object that meets the eye upon entering the long but narrow room crammed to the brim with strange-looking instruments, is a large clock with separate faces for hours, minutes, and seconds. Also on display are all parts of a Waltham watch.

The trick of seeing yourself as you actually are is accomplished by means of a set of plane mirrors set at right angles, which "tells all." Ordinary mirrors show things in reverse, but this arrangement is different, making it even possible to read print in the mirror.

Also on display in the museum is a model of Edison's first phonograph, a gift of the Edison laboratories. A strange looking machine, the device bears scarce resemblance to its modern, streamlined offspring, and used tin foil records instead of wax discs.

Another foreign-looking apparatus is an "acoustical compensator," used to illustrate the principles of submarine and other sound detection. The gadget consists of two ear pieces connected to two horns by means of rubber tubes. Topping off the structure is a disc or "compensator" which can be turned to change the length of the sound path from the detecting horn to the ear.

HANGS FROM ROOF

Hanging from the ceiling at one end of the room is a simple device which graphically demonstrates wireless wave propagation. To get the transmission effect, all that is required is a gentle tug on a piece of wood suspended by a cord from a "sender." This "sender" transmits the motion along inter-crossing threads through a number of wooden balls until it reaches the "receiver" and sets it vibrating.

The upside-down, now-you-see-it-now-you-don't trick is done with a concave mirror reflecting a small toy soldier mounted upside down on a screen, but the reflection in the mirror appears to be right side up.

Telling time by the movement of the earth is the function of the Foucault pendulum, 1,440 centimeters long, which swings over a card graduated in hours for this latitude. This "clock" is started every morning at 8, and the pendulum swings in the

same arc throughout the day, while the card remains stationary.

The device demonstrates the movement of the earth, so slow that it cannot be noticed in any other way, and gives the time within a few minutes for the rest of the day, if you can interpret it.

Another exhibit is an apparatus showing how the various parts of the mechanism operate when a car is running. This motor, differential, and transmission is push-button operated and cut away, making it possible to see the actual process of driving. It was given to the museum by the Ford Motor company.

DISPLAY FOR NATURALISTS

Of interest to nature lovers are the displays in the Biology building museum, ranging from a life-like armadillo, to cases with stuffed birds of all types, sizes, colors, and descriptions.

Mounted around the second floor railing of the building are the heads of large native and other deer and larger animals, while other cases show restored animal skeletons, butterfly and shell collections, internal organs, and other illustrations.

Live exhibits in the front part of the building are changed from week to week.

International, U. S. Table Tennis Champ At Summer Session

Reaching the top is nothing new for Jay Purves of Langdon hall, American and international table tennis champion and physical education teacher at Wisconsin high, who is attending summer session here.

Short, slim, and dark, Jay Purves comes from Des Plaines, Ill. She is a member of the Pi Beta Phi sorority.

A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Illinois, Jay played and won her first tournament match at the Palmer House in Chicago in 1933. After winning the Western championship, she defended her title in county, state, and national championship matches throughout the United States.

At the present time Jay is retired from active participation in table tennis tournaments in order to study. She plans to complete her work for her master's degree in physical education this summer, and then continue to work toward her doctor's.

"I don't intend to take up table tennis as a major activity again," the champion stated. "I want to try some-

thing different, like badminton." Selected twice to go to Europe to play in international matches to win and defend the U. S. title, she went with three other members of the team to Prague in 1936 and to Vienna in 1937.

Previous to playing in these matches she played in national matches at Wimbley, England, before 10,000 spectators, in Paris, Budapest, and in Germany.

"During one match in Germany," Jay declares, "I lost six pounds. The game was 20-15 in favor of the German star, and losing it meant that the international title would be lost for the U. S. team." The final score was 21-20. Jay Purves, the winner.

In the Vienna match, she helped the U. S. team to win the Corbillon championship, the first time an American ever held that title.

Jay is outstanding in golf and hockey as well. She played in the national hockey tournament from 1930 to 1936 and has participated in several golf tournaments.

Education Workshop Helps Teachers Meet Classroom Problems

A workshop without tools, a laboratory without equipment.

That is how you would describe the Workshop in Secondary Education which meets each week-day morning in the Education building. About 65 secondary teachers and educators are enrolled in the course.

Discussion problems include current trends in secondary education, responsibility of the high school in relation to national defense, planning of home room programs, organization of extracurricular programs, and others.

Summer School Children Attend 6th Lab. School

While their parents are attending or teaching summer school at the university, 150 children, ranging in ages from 2 to 12 years, from Wisconsin and 11 other states are spending their mornings learning about arts, music, rhythm and other subjects at the sixth annual laboratory school at Wisconsin high school.

Transformed from a high school to a complete elementary school, the Wisconsin high building houses classes from kindergarten through sixth grade, with a complete children's library and all the necessary equipment furnished by the city board of education.

The laboratory school is sponsored by the university School of Education, and in addition to providing easy, relaxed educational opportunities for the youngsters, serves as a practice teaching and observation project for 250 to 300 summer session education students.

ENROLLMENT IS UP

This year's pupil enrollment is eight above that of last year, according to Principal LeRoy Luberg, of the Madison public schools. About one-third of the pupils have attended previous sessions, some as many as four summers.

"The laboratory school is becoming an institution," Luberg said, explaining the increase. The number of practice teachers and observers is about the same as in previous years.

In addition to the elementary school courses, a course in remedial reading for high school age youths is offered every afternoon at the high school building. Directed by T. L. Harris, La Grange, Ill., this course is designed to aid the pupils in improving reading habits, through special instruction and use of the most modern equipment to record these habits and find the troubles. Also part of the laboratory school is a speech correction project under the direction of Charlotte Wells of the university speech department.

PUPILS SELECTED

Pupils for the laboratory school are accepted with a view of maintaining as even as possible a balance of ages, sexes and numbers in the various classes, and the boys and girls are "happy, normal children, who develop a fine esprit de corps and, despite widely varying backgrounds, adjust themselves easily and quickly," according to Luberg.

The school curriculum, which covers the morning includes instruction in art, music, rhythm, physical education, dramatics, recreation and swimming. The work of each grade is built around a unit theme, against the background of which all other subjects are studied. Each class chooses its own unit during the first week of the school, which runs concurrently with the summer session.

Among the units chosen this year is the Orient, which is the project of the sixth grade, and serves as the theme for the study of art, rhythm, music and other subjects studied by the class. Other projects center in the weather and health, Luberg stated.

HAVE DAILY SWIM

Each forenoon, weather permitting, the children are loaded into a school bus and taken down to the Willows beach for swimming instructions, in charge of Gladys Andrews, Alma, Mich.

"The laboratory school offers the children a rich program and demonstrates that they can make progress during the summer months under relaxed educational conditions which make it possible for them to demonstrate and use their initiative and develop skills," Luberg pointed out.

135 Students Explore Mendota At Union Historical Excursion

"And then came the white man." The white man—135 summer session students—came Saturday as honorary members of Indian clans and under the welcome sign of an Indian chief to spend a day packed full of fun, entertainment, and Indian lore on the Lake Mendota historical excursion, first summer session outing sponsored by the Memorial Union.

FILL UP ON INDIAN LORE

They listened to Indian legends, saw Indian mounds, were shown points of historic interest, heard bird calls and animal imitations from Chief Evergreen Tree, an honest-to-goodness Indian, and had a dandy boat ride doing all this.

Dr. C. E. Brown, director of the state historical museum, led the group and was assisted by Carl Hoebel.

Three boats were necessary to carry the group, one of the largest in recent years, across Lake "Wonksheek-Nomikila," the Indian name for Lake Mendota, meaning "where the Indian lives." The group was divided into four different Indian clans, the Deer, Bear, Thunderbird, and Panther, corresponding to the section of the country native to the guest.

HEAR TALL TALES

Legends as that of the Indian who after eating meat of a spirited raccoon, became so thirsty that he walked into the middle of the lake, was spirited into a fish, and may still be heard splashing about off Maple Bluff were told and retold by the leaders.

Chief Evergreen Tree, a Pueblo Indian from Texas, impressively welcomed the group from a bluff above the pier at West point as the boats came in to unload for the main stop of the day. The chief in full regalia addressed the visitors in very good English which he acquired at a Texas Indian school. He explained many of the customs of his people including the origin of his name, "Ha-cuh-ek" (Evergreen Tree), which he received at sunrise on his fourth birthday as a result of a conference of five relatives gathered that morning to be given a name by the Great Spirit.

GIVES BIRD CALLS

Chief Evergreen Tree gave many of his bird and animal calls which he has given in schools all over the nation. So realistic were his imitations that a small white poodle broke his leash when the chief imitated the sounds of a dog fight.

As a finale, the chief recited his people's philosophy of friendship with the white man:

"He may seem cruel, he may seem rude,

But when he grips you firmly by the hand, then—
One good hand shake will tell more words

Than all the things in this good earth."

Farewell point was the first stop and here the group examined the well-preserved Indian mounds on the Mendota and U. S. Veterans' hospital grounds. Among the various animal shaped mounds is a bird mound which is the largest in the world, being 624 feet in length.

Lunch was eaten at Camp Wakan-da. Dorothy Moldon Brown entertained with several Indian legends.

LAST STOP

West point, the site of an early Indian village, was the last stop and here the group met Chief Evergreen Tree.

A tired and sun-burned group waved a farewell to the chief atop the bluff as the boats left the pier. Hanging on to both port and starboard of the crowded Rose S and Badger, the happy group enjoyed a swift ride across the lake to the Park street pier.

Any pictures taken during the outing may be submitted to the Union desk before Friday, July 11, when a committee will select representative prints for a display.

The next Union outing will take place on Saturday, July 19, when Prof. George Longenecker, director of the university arboretum, will conduct a walk on the university's interesting

outdoor laboratory. The walk was originally scheduled for July 12 but has been postponed due to the use of that day as a class day. The much awaited picturesque Wisconsin tour including visits to Little Norway, Taliesin, and the Blue Mounds country is scheduled for Sunday July 27.

Prom Queen Contest Gets On Its Way

The problem of selecting a queen to reign over the summer session prom on the evening of Aug. 1 advanced towards solution yesterday with the distribution of letters to every organized women's house on the campus inviting them to enter a candidate in the contest.

The letters were sent by Bill Schilling and Bud Reynolds, summer student board members in charge of the prom queen contest. The winner of the contest and queen of the 1941 summer prom will be chosen from the contestants by a committee of student board members.

Each house is allowed one candidate and each dormitory three, according to the announcement. "Your candidate should have beauty, charm, personality, and a dash of glamour," the letter states.

DEADLINE IS MONDAY

Monday, July 14, is the deadline for entries in the contest. Candidates will be required to have photographs made, on the basis of which the contestants will be judged. Congressmen Defend 'Yoo Hoo' Division, Hit 'Sourpuss' General

Washington, July 9—(U.P.)—Congress tonight came to the defense, if too late for the rescue, of 325 footsore soldiers of the 35th "yoo hoo" division who yelled at the right girls but the wrong general on a Memphis, Tenn., golf course.

Lieut. Gen. Ben Lear, commander of the Second Army, who forced the men to march 15 miles in a broiling sun to atone for whistling at shorts-clad girl golfers and hooting at him, was assailed on the house floor as a "grouchy, golfing old general."

The troops, members of the 110t Motor Transport, were passing by a golf course headed for Camp Robinson, Ark., 150 miles west. Some of them yelled appreciatively at the girl golfers and derisively at what appeared to be a middle-aged civilian but turned out to be Gen. Lear, outranked in the U. S. army only by Gen. George C. Marshall, chief-of-staff.

Rep. Paul H. Kilday, D., Tex., a member of the house military affairs committee, today demanded that Lear inform him whether the soldiers' misconduct "came to your attention while in the field with your troops on important maneuvers or while on a golf course."

Kilday informed Lear he was "contemplating introduction of a resolution to investigate your severe punishment." He said he had the impression that Lear's action "in the name of discipline was actually to assuage your personal resentment because of remarks directed at you while you were not in uniform and your identity not known."

Rep. Everett M. Dirksen, R., O., prefers soldiers who have an eye for pretty girls to "sour pussies."

He told the house he didn't know whether public funds should be spent by some grouchy, golfing old general to develop sourpuss soldiers."

"For my part," he said, "I'll take the kind of soldiers that these boys are."



battle, until the Yanks were forced to retire.

Schore's outfit moved back, finally, every man wounded, and those who could still walk carried others more seriously hurt.

"I was hit in three places. But I could still move along. We brought the live ones back along with us," Schore recalls.

PROMISED TO ALL

Every man in Schore's machine gun company was promised the Purple Heart award, and Schore himself was among those who stood before the allied commanders in Paris a few months after Chateau-Thierry while the generals pinned on France's Croix de Guerre, and the United States Congressional Medal of Honor.

That recognition Schore received on time.

But it took the government 23 years to recall the service 10 soldiers gave in that battle back in 1917. The heart-shaped token, with George Washington's profile silver-engraved on its purple surface, arrived only this week, when war department officials checked back on recent service records received in Washington.

11 GET AWARD

Really, 11 men were given the Purple Heart medal when the war department uncovered its mistake, but one of them had to be sent to a widow in a small town north of Sauk City, Schore says.

The Fourth division got back to the states in April, 1920, and Schore was honorably discharged. But in spite of 20 months' service overseas, he hadn't seen enough of France. Only her battlefields.

With a buddy, he took his back army pay, plus the \$60 the army gave each discharged soldier, and climbed on a ship for—all places—France.

"We went back there again, and were in Germany, France, and England until the money got short. Then we pushed back home," the veteran recalls.

HOLD ANNUAL REUNION

Nowadays, his only connection with the old army outfit, aside from membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars and Disabled American Veterans, is the yearly reunion of the machine gun company, held last year in Madison's Olin park.

Back they come, every one with the vivid memory of Chateau-Thierry's fire and shock. From all over the Midwest, as far as the Dakotas and Montana, 57 veterans arrive.

"The boys always come, too," Schore says proudly.

Does he think we're "doing it right" this time?

"This time we're late," he declares. "We should have kept right on going, making tanks, guns."

But it's better this time. When Schore went over in '17, the British and French provided the artillery and planes. Now, at least, he says, "We can send a few bombers."

"Now we have automatic rifles. We

Vigilant Watch
Over Mendota
Guards Students

Clear, sharp eyes eternally scanning blue Lake Mendota, 12 husky and competent life-guards, and two powerful and speedy motor boats are provided by the University of Wisconsin to protect student swimmers and boat-ers on the lake.

Harvey Black, chief life-guard, is stationed with three others at the university boat-house, where powerful binoculars are trained on the waters of Lake Mendota throughout the day from 9 a. m. to 10 p. m. on weekdays and beginning an hour earlier on Sundays and holidays. At the boat-house too are stationed the rescue boats, which can roar away at up to 40 m. p. h. to pick up unlucky sailboaters or canoers who have been spilled into the water.

GUARD PIERS

Lifeguards provided by the university are stationed at piers used by students too; two at each of the piers for the YMCA, Elizabeth Waters hall, and the men's dorms; one at the new dorms pier, and the tent colony, and one who cruises in a rowboat along the fraternities and sorority piers.

Only last Sunday, 10 persons were rescued from the lake by the life-guards in the powerful speedboat "Isabel," named for the colorful Great Lakes skipper who for many years had charge of the life-guard service. The casualties were caused by the upsetting of three sailboats and a canoe.

doing the hauling. Where in the world will Hitler get the boats to send 'em? "But I wish it was over," he adds. "It makes it bad all over."

"Sometimes two weeks go by without anything happening out on the lake at all," life-guard Black said. "But at other times, we may make over a dozen rescues in a single day. Last season, we picked up 27 persons on two different days."

RESCUE LARGE NUMBER

A total of 244 persons were rescued by the boat-house guards last year, and a dozen distressed swimmers by the pier guards.

"Most of the accidents come from sailboat and canoe tip-overs," Black explained. "Canoe tipping is usually due to fooling around or racing, or changing seats improperly."

Black pointed out that a city ordinance requires that a life preserver be supplied for each passenger in all canoes, motorboats, and sailboats.



Reveal Plans For Defenses Against British

Philadelphia—(U.P.)—Dredges working on the Delaware river have uncovered an ingenious but unsuccessful defense planned by George Washington to protect Philadelphia from the British in 1777.

The dredges and shovels, used in a reclamation project by an oil concern, first began to bring up iron-snouted poles sunk in the river bed in rock-weighted wooden pens.

Officials consulted an old map of the city, and learned that the course of the Delaware had changed somewhat since the days of the revolution. They also discovered that the poles apparently were a network of chevauxs-de-friese, a protective line of iron spikes, which the defenders of the city strung across the river to keep the British ships from moving up the channel.

During high tide this line of spikes was under water and any English ship approaching did so at the risk of having its bottom torn out. The "spikes" were 33 feet long, and placed in the boxes at 45 degree angles, pointing down the river. A channel was left for American ships to clear, and a long chain was stretched across at the channel point.

The British could not approach the barricade as long as the guns of old Fort Mifflin, on the Pennsylvania shore, could keep firing. But with the destruction of this fort by Lord Howe's batteries, and Washington's reverses at Brandywine and Germantown, the city had to be abandoned.

Lord Howe brought his supply ships to Philadelphia, and Washington then retired to Valley Forge for the winter.

BRITISH SUPPLIES TO RUSSIA

London—(U.P.)—Two to three million well-equipped Soviet troops are being thrown into the pivotal Smolensk-Moscow sector of the Russian front against German forces who thus far have been able to gain less than half their objectives, a competent British military commentator claimed last night.

British war supplies already are en route to the Russians, it was disclosed, in the hopes that with their aid the German war machine may be completely stopped.

FINNS CLAIM CAPTURES

Helsinki—(U.P.)—Finnish troops striking eastward across the Russian frontier have captured five towns, the Finnish high command reported last night after squadrons of Soviet planes bombed Helsinki, killing at least 17 persons and injuring 165 others.

FLYING FORTRESSES' ARRIVE

An Air Station Somewhere In England—(U.P.)—Twenty flying fortresses, Britain's entire first order from the United States, have arrived in England. Most of them already have passed through here for testing, repainting and a few modifications. So have an even larger number of Liberators, some Martin Marylands, Douglas DB7's and Vought-Sikorski scout bombers.

REPORTERS BARRED FROM ICELAND

London, Thursday, July 10—(U.P.)—The three American press associations were informed early today that Iceland "is now closed to all correspondents" and the ministry of information has cancelled arrangements for reporters to visit the island where American forces landed on Monday.

FORBID ICELAND VISITS

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—The state department said without explanation last night that it will not issue or validate passports for Iceland, where American naval forces landed on Monday, except for officials who have business there. The department was swamped during the day with requests for permission to visit the island. All of them were rejected.

SIX NURSES MISSING

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—Six American Red Cross nurses are missing following the "barbaric" torpedoing of a British ship bearing them to London for hospital duty, Chairman Norman H. Davis announced Wednesday.

The incident occurred a fortnight

ago. Neither the identity of the craft nor the place where it was sunk were revealed. It was the second vessel transporting Red Cross nurses to be sunk in the Atlantic since the war began.

CHIANG KAI-SHEK ESCAPES DEATH

New York—(U.P.)—Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek narrowly escaped death in a Japanese air raid on Chungking, according to a Tokyo radiocast recorded last night by NBC. The raid came while the generalissimo was attending celebrations on the end of the fourth year of war between China and Japan.

DRAFT LOTTERY NEXT THURSDAY

Washington—(U.P.)—The nation's second peacetime draft lottery to determine the order in which an estimated 750,000 new registrants will be subject to call for military service will be held here Thursday, July 17, under tentative plans announced today by selective service headquarters.

INTERVENE IN BORDER DISPUTE

Washington—(U.P.)—The United States, Argentina and Brazil intervened Wednesday in an attempt to mediate the Peruvian-Ecuadorian border dispute which Acting Secretary of State Sumner Welles suggested may have been inspired by foreign meddlers.

Welles disclosed that diplomatic representatives of the three mediating nations have proposed creation of a "no man's" land along the Peruvian-Ecuadorian boundary while they seek audiences with the foreign ministers of the disputant republics.

Roosevelt's instructions to the navy to "take all necessary measures" to keep open Atlantic sealanes.

'NO ROOM FOR DOUBT'

"There is no room for doubt of what may be done," he said, "but I leave the interpretations to you."

Churchill, remarking that American ships en route to and from Iceland would traverse "the most dangerous waters" of the Atlantic, said:

"It may, I dare say, be found mutually advantageous in practice that the two navies involved should assist each other as far as convenient—if any issue of principle arises, it may safely be left to British and American naval, military, and air force authorities who will, I have no doubt, study each other's convenience to the utmost."

WHEELER CHALLENGES FDR

Developments caused Sen. Burton K. Wheeler, isolationist leader under fire from the White House and London for announcing last Thursday that America would occupy Iceland, to challenge the president to ask congress for a declaration of war against Germany.

In the gargantuan battle of Russia raging along the 1,800-mile front from the Arctic to the Black sea, both sides claimed advantages but the odds seemed to favor the Russians—at least to the point that the German offensive appeared to be stalled in most sectors.

GERMAN CLAIMS

The German BNB agency claimed that Nazi forces pushing towards Leningrad had captured Ostrov, Fellin, and Pernau—190 miles south of the Soviet Baltic port and No. 2 city—but the Nazi high command kept complete silence on details of military operations.

Moscow claimed that Germans on the vital central front 325 miles west of Moscow, in the Lepel sector, had been routed in a savage Soviet counter-attack. This followed by a few hours Moscow's description of a great victory in a smashing counter-drive on the Bessarabian front, in which German and Rumanian forces were said to have been driven back across the Pruth river into Rumania.

Author Will Lead Forum Tonight

"The Way Out for America" will be the title of a forum led by Charles C. Pickert, co-author of the book of the same name, held in the Old Madison room Friday night, July 11, at 8 p.m.

A radical solution for farm surpluses and other economic ills will be presented by the speaker. A bill is now pending in congress which incorporates Pickert's aims. It was introduced in the senate by Senator Capper of Kansas.

Pickert is an officer of the Institute for Christian Economic Action, a charitable organization incorporated for the purpose of eliminating internal strife by correcting the underlying economic tension from which the strife originates.

The forum is presented by the Union forum committee and is open to the public without charge.

indirect and through public opinion.

Citing the case of the railroad brotherhood in 1916, in which the brotherhood was victorious temporarily but which caused in part an anti-labor movement after the war, he explained that labor leaders tried to hold strikes down because they knew that the labor movement would have to pay.

"We are dealing with a new government in the process of formation," Professor Perlman continued. "Making full allowance for imperfections, the only way to understand labor is a nascent government.

"The fact that there is such a nascent government is there. The way to handle it is to harness it to the cause of law and order and to recognize that it is not only a political government that we live under, but also an industrial government, and that the latter must be worked out just as carefully."

Conservative persons say that strikes should be handled by congressional law which makes strikes and lockouts illegal and the sentiment on compulsory arbitration is prominent, the speaker explained.

He continued to explain that the proponents of the method of submitting the case to a tribunal for an award have overlooked the problem of enforcing the award. In addition, if strikes were made illegal, the government would deprive itself one of its effective aids to settlement; the aid of national leaders who would be afraid to lead a strike because of its illegality.
