Scripture Reading. CHRIST'S SOLDIERS. Epn. 6: 1-4; 10-19.


PASTOR. - Children, obey your parents in the Lord : for this is right.





PASTOR. — Verily I say unto you, Except ye turn, and become as little children, ye shall in no wise enter into the kingdom of heaven.










Presentation of Bibles. (To children who during the year have reached the age of seven.)






