



GENERAL INFORMATION.

The preparations of this Company meet the requirements of the kindred professions of medicine and pharmacy. They are not adapted to popular use nor are they supplied to the general public under any circumstances. Our catalogs and printed matter are distributed through professional channels only.

The preparations in this list are of the high standard of quality that has given reputation to our products for almost a century. The purity of materials, the skill and accuracy of the workmanship all contribute to this end, but economy of production, the result of long experience, enables us to offer our products at prices comparing advantageously with the cost of goods less favorably known.

EMERGENCY ORDERS

Our direct accounts are confined entirely to Wholesale Druggists. We give prompt attention to small emergency orders for goods not obtainable from local distributors; but such orders must be accompanied in each case by the name of the jobber through whom the charge can be rendered. In cases where jobbing connections are not already established, it is desirable that such orders be accompanied by postal order or bank draft to avoid the delay of first securing the jobber's acceptance of the account. We do not send goods C. O. D.

GUARANTY

All our products are guaranteed by us under the Food and Drugs Act, June 30, 1906.

PARCEL POST PACKAGES

Within the restriction of the regulations, liquids and solids may be sent by parcel post provided they are neither corrosive, inflammable nor poisonous to those handling them in the event of possible breakage. Unless otherwise instructed, we insure parcel post packages, charging the cost upon the invoice.

CLAIMS FOR SHORTAGE

All goods leaving our laboratories are double checked by competent employees, packed by careful and experienced packers, and claims of any kind should be duly considered before being filed. Small parcels are often thrown out in unpacking, and goods are sometimes taken from shipments to fill orders before the invoice is checked. It is embarrassing to refuse credits, asked in good faith, and we would therefore request careful examination, where articles are reported short, before claim is made.

BREAKAGE IN TRANSIT

Losses through breakage in transit are avoidable and unnecessary, provided our customers co-operate with us and make prompt report of all such losses. In the absence of prompt report, the opportunity to recover from the carrier is lost, and the customer thereby takes the loss upon himself.

We maintain our own Claim Department, so that our customers do not have to deal with the transportation companies. They have only to send us the data, to receive a credit memorandum forthwith and we will take care of the claim entry.

Do not give the railroad or express company a clean receipt for goods which show rough handling, or evidence of damage, but insist that the agent note on the Paid Expense Bill the condition of the packages. See that all packages received for are really received.

“CONCEALED” LOSS OR DAMAGE.

Where the package appears to be in good condition, but the breakage is excessive, stop unpacking, call in the railroad agent immediately, so he can inspect it and made a record of the damage. Have him sign this record on the Paid Expense Bill.

Where the package itself is in good order, and there is damage to contents it is known in railroad circles as "Concealed Loss or Damage." The carriers recognize their liability in such cases and invariably allow the full amount, if the local agent's record is clear through his inspection, or if claim is supported by affidavit, a blank form for which we will supply on request. Send to the Merrell Company:

1. Itemized invoice of the damage, showing the net loss.
2. Original Paid Expense Bill, showing notation of loss. If no notation, send affidavit.
3. Label from the damaged package (not essential but desirable).

NEW LABELS FOR REDRESSING STOCK

Loose labels cannot be furnished under any conditions. All outgoing packages have a laboratory control number, recording the manufacturing and packing records. The label, therefore, is the manufacturer's guaranty of accuracy, which he cannot extend except to an original package labeled and control-marked in his own laboratories.

LOANS OR ADVANCES TO AGENTS

Our representatives are supplied with ample funds for their needs, and we will therefore recognize no claim made upon us for account of loans, advances or other obligations incurred by them. Agents of this Company are not permitted to make drafts for any purpose whatever without our direct authority in each and every instance.

SPECIAL FORMULAE

In accepting orders for Special Formulae it will be necessary for us to set a limit as to the minimum quantity owing to the fact that there is considerable expense involved in putting small batches through and our machines are not adapted to handling small quantities. Therefore in soliciting orders for special formulae the quantities must not be less than the following:

Merrell's Natural Salicylic Acid represents the maximum therapeutic value possible in this product, with minimum properties which, in the synthetic product, cause gastric disturbances, impairment of the heart action and other untoward effects. 










The hydrogen ion apparatus used for adjusting the acidity of Proteogens to the same hydrogen ion concentration as the blood.





For many years attempts have been made to devise a satisfactory machine for making suppositories by cold compression, but in the past the machines have been too expensive and complicated for the average pharmacy in prescription work.

After a great deal of patient experimental work a simple little device has been perfected by a practical druggist and the Merrell Company, having secured the patent rights, offers a compression machine within the reach of every drug clerk.

While the device is as simple as can be, it requires just a little practice to acquire proficiency in its use, but when once mastered, it is such a delight that the few moments required to learn how to use it will relieve the dispenser of many an irritating experience later.

The successful use of the Merrell Suppository Machine depends upon a correct suppository mass. Cocoa Butter alone is a little too brittle for compression and should be prepared by working up in mortar with a few drops of Olive Oil. A mass that is of a proper consistence to roll will usually make a perfect suppository in the Merrell Machine.

DIRECTIONS.

The Cocoa Butter is scraped or grated into a mortar; powder the medicating ingredients, or if solid extract rub to a smooth paste with a few drops of water (some extracts require alcohol, glycerin or olive oil, but water is preferable and will usually suffice), and add to the Cocoa Butter. Rub to a smooth pilular mass and if brittle add a few drops of olive oil.

MISCELLANEOUS PREPARATIONS—Continued.

Take the Merrell Suppository Machine—which should be perfectly clean—and dust the inside of the mould with a little Lycopodium, shaking out the excess.

IMPORTANT.—If the point of the suppository breaks and sticks in the body of the machine, remember this is not the fault of the machine, but usually due to the condition of the mass. If this happens, clean up the machine thoroughly, again dust with Lycopodium and if the mass is brittle, add a few drops of olive oil in addition and the result will be satisfactory.





ALSO NOTE.—The heat of your hands may warm the machine so that the suppository will be soft. If this happens, dip the device containing the suppository in cold water for ten or fifteen seconds. In warm weather, this is always desirable. Punch out the suppository—dust with Lycopodium and proceed as before.

Sometimes a mass will stick and the suppository break in spite of all your effort. If this is the case, drop a few drops of Linimentum Saponis into the mold and pour out the excess, dust with Lycopodium and proceed.

The suppository will adhere to the end of the ejector and may be placed in the box without coming in contact with the hands, as illustrated in Fig. 4. Replace the mould, dust with Lycopodium as before (after each suppository), and repeat until the required number of suppositories have been made.







Chart showing potency and growth-promoting effect of Vitazym Pills.

This line of fluid medicines—prepared in the interest of physicians generally—follows the standards of medicinal strength and the principles of manipulation laid down in the "Digest of Materia Medica and Pharmacy" of Prof. Albert Merrell, of St. Louis.

The scheme of this work involves the following important points:

The adoption of the drug, chemical or proximate principle of ascertained purity or quality as the unit of strength and calling it the "Normal," i. e., *the standard* for comparison, after the analogous use of the word in volumetric analysis and in other instances in science.

In case of drugs from the vegetable kingdom which are injured by age or complete desiccation, they are to be manipulated in the undried or partly dried state, but the product is standardized by the amount of the drug it will produce.

The preparations from each drug represent a definite fraction or multiple by weight of such drug. The most important of these preparations is the "Normal," which is an alcoholic solution representing its own weight of the drug from which it is made, and is a definite and uniform fluid equivalent of such drug.

Each Cc. of Normal represents one gram of the crude drug from which it is prepared, and such as are made from drugs containing alkaloids are standardized by the same processes of assay and physiological tests as are the fluid extracts of the same drug.

A preparation one-half the strength of the "Normal" is called a "Semi-Normal," so too these may be "Deci-Normal" (1/10th of normal strength), or "Bi-Normal," etc., twice normal strength.

The term "Normal" originally used in this connection, aptly designates a line of fluid medicines that are true representatives of the drugs from which they are made; definite in strength, accurate in dosage, and possessing in a superior degree the full therapeutic qualities of the prime fresh drugs. They will at once commend themselves to all physicians who appreciate the importance of accuracy in dosage and reliability in the quality of the remedies they prescribe.






