

### **COVERING THE BADGERS**

**COMMUNICATIONS CENTER:** Wisconsin's working facilities for press-radio-television are located on the west side of Camp Randall Stadium and can be reached from Breese Terrace via the elevator at Gate 6.

WORKING TICKETS: All Requests for Communications Center tickets must be placed with the Sports Information Office. Upon acceptance of applications, appropriate tickets are either mailed or held for pickup at the Press Will Call window at the ground level entrance at Gate 6, Section E. Working press tickets contain assigned seat locations. Telecopier service will be available to members of the working press by the appropriate servicing organizations.

RADIO: Each station admitted for broad

casting by signed contract will be issued five booth tickets. Booths are assigned and tickets mailed upon receipt of necessary fees and signed contract. If tickets are not mailed, they may be picked up in advance at the Sports News Service Office, or on game day at the Press Will Call window.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Field passes are limited to daily newspaper, wire service, and television photographers who may work from assigned space in booths on the Radio-TV level, or from the east or west sidelines (except between the 30-yard lines) and beyond the end zone.

**PARKING:** A limited number of parking passes for Lots 18 and 19 are available to working media only. They will be issued as requested.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS:** Player interviews will be held in the "W" Club Annex following practice as prearranged with the Sports Information Office. There will be no player interviews allowed on Thursdays and Fridays.

Media representatives will be able to interview Wisconsin players after each game following a short post-game meeting of the squad and coaches. All post-game interviews will be conducted in the Media Interview Room.

COACHES INTERVIEWS: Dave McClain will meet with media representatives following each game after a short post-game meeting with team and coaches. The post-game interview of Coach McClain will be conducted in the Media Interview Room.

The Media Interview Room on game days is the Wisconsin Weight Training Room directly below the Wisconsin Dressing Room.

Best time to interview Coach McClain is from 2:30-3:15 Thursdays, or 2:00 to 3:00 Fridays before home games, or after practice each day.

**Jim Mott** is a Madison native and has B.A. degrees in Zoology and Journalism from the University of Wisconsin. As an undergraduate, he served as Wisconsin's basketball team manager for four years, earning a major "W" award for his work.

**Jim** is a past president of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and the Madison Pen and Mike Club. He was named to the CoSIDA Hall fo Fame in 1979.

He and his wife **Dorothy** are the parents of three sons — **William**, 21, **David**, 18, and **Eric**, 16. **Bob Leu** joined Wisconsin's Athletic Department staff as Radio-TV Director in September, 1973 from WHA-TV where he had served as producer-director and director of sports.

He's a Milwaukee native and a 1960 graduate of the University of Wisconsin with a Bachelor of Arts degree in speech.

**Bob** handles radio and television contracts for the athletic department and is the producer of Wisconsin's post-season football, basketball, and hockey highlight films. He has also done color commentary on Wisconsin's hockey broadcasts, and has served in past years as producer-host of Badger Football on the state's public television stations.

### THE HEAD COACH—DAVE McCLAIN

Dave McClain begins his sixth season as head coach at Wisconsin after being named Wisconsin's 24th head coach on December 16, 1977.

The 45 year-old McClain, a native of Upper Sandusky, Ohio, and a 1960 graduate of Bowling Green University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Education, came to Wisconsin from a highly successful coaching stint at Ball State, where he posted an overall 46-25-3 record in seven seasons.

His overall 73-53-5 record for twelve seasons as a head coach ranks him among the nation's Top Twenty coaches entering 1983. That's a winning percentage of .576.

McClain played football at Upper Sandusky High School and Bowling Green University, where his team went 45-5-4. He played both quarterback and safety at Bowling Green.

He started his coaching career at Crestline, Ohio High School with an 8-1 record and then returned to Bowling Green as a graduate assistant in 1961, where he served as freshmen offensive coach and earned his Master's Degree in Education.

He then served as an assistant coach at Cornell University under Tom Harp in 1962; at Miami (Ohio) University under Glenn E. "Bo" Schembechler, 1963-66; at Kansas under Pepper Rodgers, 1967-68; and at Ohio State under W. W. "Woody" Hayes in 1969 and 1970 before accepting the head coaching job at Ball State.

He coached seven seasons at Ball State, with only his first a loser at 4-5-1. He was named Mid American Conference "Coach of the Year" in 1975 after a 9-2 season. His three year MAC record of 13-4 included the 1976 conference title.

In his first season with the Badgers, he became the first coach since Ivan Williamson in 1949 to post a winning mark as a first year coach. Those 1978 Badgers opened with four straight wins and finished at 5-4-2; the first winning season since 1974. The next two seasons proved to be a little tougher as his 1979 and 1980 squads posted identical 4-7-0 marks.

The next season started the turnaround. In 1981 the Badgers went 7-5-0 including the first Bowl appearance for a Wisconsin team since the 1962 season. Their 6-3-0 Big Ten record was good for a third place tie, and included wins over national powers Michigan and Ohio State. The Badgers lost to Tennessee 28-21 in the Garden State Bowl.

In 1982, Dave became the first coach in Wisconsin history to guide the Badgers to back-to-back Bowl games and accomplished what no other Wisconsin coach was able to do — win a post season Bowl game. The Badgers won a 14-3 decision from Kansas State in the 1982 Independence Bowl to cap a second consecutive 7-5 season, which included the first victory over Ohio State in Columbus since 1918.

Dave has also served as an assistant coach in the Hula (1982) and Japan (1983) Bowl games.

He served in 1982 as a member of a special subcommittee of the NCAA Recruiting Committee to review proposed recruiting legislation under consideration for submission to the NCAA Council and the NCAA's annual convention.

Dave and his wife, the former Judy Perry, have three children — son Tom 17, and daughters Mindy 15 and Marcy 12.

### 1983 WISCONSIN FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

Coach Dave McClain's Badgers accomplished quite a few firsts in 1982.

Let's take a look, in review -

a) back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1962 and 1963 seasons when the Badgers were 8-1 and 5-4, respectively;

b) back-to-back winning Big Ten seasons for the first time since 1961 and 1962 seasons when the Badgers were 4-3 and 6-1, respectively;


c) the first victory by a Wisconsin football team at Columbus, Ohio since 1918 when the Badgers blanked the Buckeyes 6-0 in early October (also the first win ever by the Badgers in Ohio Stadium which was built in 1922);

by junior quarterback Randy Wright averaged 206.6 yards rushing and 197.0 yards passing per game:


g) set an all-time school record for passing yardage in a season — 2,167 yards — and an average of 197.0 yards per game. The 1961 Wisconsin football team paced the nation in passing offense with 188.4 yards per game. This year — the year of the pass — Wisconsin ranked just sixth in the Big Ten and 35th nationally;

h) a 14-3 win over Kansas State in the 7th annual Independence Bowl game — first bowl win ever by a Wisconsin football team.

d) the first team to accomplish back-to-back victories against Ohio State (Badgers won 24-21 in Madison in 1981) since Wisconsin teams of 1913, 1914 and 1915 won three straight games;

e) a pair of Big Ten shutouts for the first time since 1954; Wisconsin blanked Ohio State 6-0 on the road and dealt Minnesota a 24-0 defeat in the season finale (in 1954 the Badgers triumphed 6-0 at Michigan State and completed the year by handing Minnesota a 27-0 thumping in Madison);

f) the first Wisconsin football team ever to average over 400 yards total offense in a season — 403.6 yards per game — as an attack guided

The 1983 Badger Football team will have to overcome some heavy graduation losses in order to have a third consecutive winning season and post-season bowl appearance. Only eight starters from last season — four on offense and four on defense — return to the line-up this fall. Overall, Coach McClain's Badgers have only 24 lettermen returning — 14 offense, 10 defense — as 29 lettermen will not return. The major tasks to be accomplished are the rebuilding of the offensive and defensive lines, the finding of offensive backfield replacements, and strengthening of the defensive secondary.


The offensive line suffered heavily from graduation as four of five starters are gone, including all-Big Ten tackle Bob Winckler and center Ron Versnik, a three-year starter. Counted on heavily will be the lone returning starter, junior tackle Jeff Dellenbach, along with sophomore guard Bob Landsee and junior tackle Kevin Belcher, both of whom saw considerable action last season. Dan Turk, a transfer from Drake, is expected to fill the center position while juniors Brian Jansen and Chris Osswald and sophomore Bill Schick will battle for the other guard spot.

Another area hit hard was the backfield with the departure of four 1000-yard career rushers fullback Gerald Green, and tailbacks Troy King, John Williams, and Chucky Davis. The big key be the passing game, spearheaded by senior quarterback Randy Wright. Wright returns after an outstanding junior campaign in which he rewrote the Wisconsin record book, setting eleven school records and tying one. Backing up Wright will be freshman red-shirt Mike Howard, who completed 9 of 18 passes for 96 yards and a touchdown in leading his team to a win in the spring game. The receiving corps is strong with everyone returning except split end Tim Stracka. Al Toon (32 catches for 472 yards and 5 TDs), Jeff Nault (25 catches for 323 yards and 4 TDs), and Michael Jones (16 catches for 259 yards and 2 TDs) return to give Wright some fine targets. It is also hoped that David Keeling (18 catches for 251 yards and 1 TD) can regain his eligibility.

### FRED JACKSON—Receivers

Newest member of Wisconsin's football staff is Fred Jackson, who comes to Dave McClain's staff after three years as an assistant coach at the University of Toledo.

Jackson, who coached Toledo's quarterbacks and wide receivers, entered the collegiate ranks in 1980 from the head coaching position at Southwestern High School in Flint, MI.

While at Southwestern High School he produced such outstanding college stars as Michigan's Rick Leach and Rodney Feaster; Purdue's Jerome Oliver and Ron Moore; Michigan State's Darryl Turner; Penn State's Booker Moore; and Toledo's Emmanuel Cole and Capus Robinson.

The 34-year-old Jackson is a native of Baton Rouge, LA. He was an all-state quarter-back at Scotlandville High School in 1965 and 1966 and after his 1967 graduation from high school, went on to star at Jackson State University in 1968, 1969, and 1970. The linebacking corps is the strength of the defense. Returning are starters Jim Melka, last years leading tackler, and senior Tri-Captain Mike Herrington. The two remaining spots will be ably filled and good back-up provided by red-shirt freshmen Rick Graf, Michael Reid, Craig Raddatz, Ted Teske, and Mark Polivka; sophomore Tim Jordan; and juniors Russ Fields and Brad Grabow.

The secondary lost five of its top eight from last year's two-deep including all-Big Ten performers David Greenwood and Matt Vanden Boom. Starters Richard Johnson and Brian

The kicking game is sound with all specialists returning. Sophomore George Winslow will once again handle the punting. Kevin Rohde will take care of the extra point and short field goal assignments. Wendell Gladem will have the kicking off and long field goal duties.

In Big Ten play in 1982, Wisconsin's offense totalled 414 yards per game, fourth best. The Badgers again ranked among the top rushing teams with 221.0 yards per game, third best in the league. They were sixth best in passing yardage — 193.0 per game — and they averaged 23.4

ranked 39th.

This year's schedule is once again tough, but the seven games played at home are a plus. The Badger's open at home against non-conference foes Northern Illinois and Missouri before facing the Wolverines of Michigan at Camp Randall on September 24. The remainder of the season is comprised of rugged conference games starting with a clash at Evanston with Northwestern. The rest of the slate includes four home games — Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, and Michigan State; and three road games — Minnesota, Ohio State, and Purdue.

Hopefully, all the holes can be filled and a successful season encountered, including a twelfth game for the third consecutive year.

### Hirsch Guides Wisconsin Athletic Program

Elroy "Crazylegs" Hirsch is in his 15th year as Wisconsin's Director of Athletics and he's the guiding force behind one of the finest athletic programs for men and women in the United States today.

Wisconsin's men's and women's athletic programs have consistently ranked in the Big Ten's first division during his tenure over the past four-

een years.

The Wausau native came back to Wisconsin—where he gained collegiate fame as a star sophomore running back in leading the Badgers to a No. 3 ranking during the 1942 football season—from the Los Angeles Rams on February 28, 1969.

His original appointment as athletic director—slated to end in 1979—was first extended in 1974 by the school's athletic board through June 30, 1984, and again in April, 1979 through June 30, 1988 by Chancellor **Irving Shain** upon recom-

mendation of the Athletic Board.

Chancellor Shain stated in a letter to Hirsch, "I am very pleased to take this present action. My own observations certainly support the opinion of the Athletic Board that you are one of the outstanding athletic directors, not only in the Big Ten — our 'home' conference, but also in the country at large. I am personally, as well as professionally, delighted to have you as a member of our university staff."

His career has been one of success.

Wisconsin fans, especially the older generation, remember him as a triple threat halfback on **Harry Stuhldreher's** 1942 football team that won eight games, lost only to Iowa, and tied Notre Dame.

Hirsch's play as a 19-year-old sophomore on Wisconsin's 1942 football team carried the Badgers to the brink of the national championship. The Wausau native rushed for 766 yards on 141 carries — his best was 174 yards on 22 attempts vs. Missouri — and his overall contribution added 226 yards passing, 390 yards on receptions and runbacks of punts, kickoffs, and interceptions plus nine touchdowns, five by rushing and four by passing.

He played at Michigan in 1943, as a Marine trainee, and he not only played football, but also basketball, track and baseball. He won his "M" in each sport, the only athlete ever to accomplish

such a feat at Michigan.

He had a successful professional football career, first as halfback with the Chicago Rockets of the post-war All-American Conference, and later with the Los Angeles Rams for nine seasons as one of the all-time great ends.

It was at Los Angeles that "Crazylegs" was to attain new heights in his career. The Rams, in transition to the modern passing game, often split him wide as a receiver and finally moved him permanently to end — establishing him as the first flanker

Hirsch was one of the athletes - like Otto

Graham and Sam Huff and Gino Marchetti—who brought special talents to the sport in the 1950's as it changed from two-way players to offensive and defensive specialists under free substitution.

In 1951 Hirsch displayed all his talents as he put together one of the finest seasons in National Football League history. He gained 1,495 yards on receptions, an all-time record approached only by Bobby Mitchell of the Washington Redskins (1,436 yards in 1963) and Hirsch had only twelve games to set the record, not 14, like Mitchell!

That same season **Hirsch** caught 17 touchdown passes to tie the league record set by **Don Hutson** of the Packers in 1942. He also caught at least one touchdown pass through 11 consecutive games over the 1950 and 1951 seasons.

Elroy compiled a total of 343 passes caught for 6,299 yards and 53 touchdown catches during his career with the Rams before retiring from NFL

play following the 1957 season.

He was a successful executive with the Rams, first as general manager of the team, and later assistant to the president of the team, a job he relinquished to accept the job as Wisconsin athletic director.

He's been named to the Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame (1965), to professional football's Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio (1968), to the National Football Hall of Fame in New York (1974), and to the Madison Sports Hall of Fame (1977).

He's also a member of the all-time NFL All-Star team for his play as end and flanker during his nine year career with the Los Angeles Rams.

Elroy and his wife, Ruth, are the parents of son Win Stephen, Los Angeles, and daughter Patricia Caroline, a recent University of Wisconsin graduate.

### **WISCONSIN ATHLETIC OFFICIALS**

#### PROF. FRANK J. REMINGTON

Frank has served as Wisconsin's Big Ten Faculty Representaive and a member of the school's athletic board since 1959, except for the 1970-71 school year. He chaired the athletic board in 1966 and 1967.

The lawyer-educator, who has been a member of the law faculty since 1949, is one of the nation's foremost authorities on criminal justice and administration.

A native of Schenectady, N.Y., he received his B.S. (1947) and his LL.B. (1949) degrees from Wisconsin. He also studied at Union College and held a research scholarship at the University of Michigan.

He served a term on the NCAA's Constitution and By-Laws Committee starting in 1966.


**Diane Johnson** was appointed Assistant Director of Athletics for Student Personnel Services in May, 1978, replacing **John C. Hickman** who retired.

### TWO BADGER NUMBERS RETIRED

Two football jersey numbers have been retired in Wisconsin's football history. They are No. 80, worn by All-American end Dave Schreiner when he was an All-American end in 1941 and 1942; and No. 83, worn by quarterback Allan J. Shafer in 1944.

Schreiner was killed in action with the U.S. Marine Corps during the battle of Okinawa, June, 1945. Shafer was fatally injured in the second half of the 1944 Wisconsin-Iowa football game and died shortly after Wisconsin had defeated the Hawkeyes 26-7 in Camp Randall stadium, November 11, 1944.

### WISCONSIN ALL-TIME FOOTBALL TEAM

Six All-American football players were picked on Wisconsin's all-time football team by fans during the 1969 centennial season of collegiate football.

Fullback Alan 'The Horse' Ameche, 1953 and 1954 All-American and 1954 Heisman Trophy winner, was voted Wisconsin's all-time greatest football player in the poll.

In the backfield with Ameche are quarterback Ron Vander Kelen (1962); and Marlin 'Pat' Harder and Elroy 'Crazylegs' Hirsch, members of the famed 1942 Wisconsin team that posted an 8-1-1 record and a No. 3 national ranking.

The ends named are All-American Dave Schreiner (1941 and 1942) and Pat Richter (1961 and



### CAMP RANDALL HISTORY

The University of Wisconsin is proud that its sports center is more than just an athletic field—and that the drama and excitement of football seasons are set against a backdrop of colorful Wisconsin history.

In its 90 years of ownership, the University has expanded the facilities there until they include a large stadium, fieldhouse, memorial practice building and football practice fields.

But the University didn't name it. The name was decided long before that by veterans of the Civil War who knew it was a great military camp named for a wartime governor. When the University took it over they insisted that the name be preserved forever as a memorial to their fallen friends.

In the days before the Civil War, the site was owned by the State Agricultural Society whose yearly state fairs attracted holidaying throngs there. With the outbreak of the war, however, the society turned the place over to the government to become the state's major training center.

The land again became the state fair grounds when peace returned and when Gen. U.S. Grant visited it 15 years later he hailed the transformation as "a symbol of beating the spears of war into the plowshares of peace."

Other visitors to the grounds were Gens. Sherman and Sheridan and Pres. Hayes. When the state fair was moved to Milwaukee and a few years later even the Dane County Agricultural Society stopping using it for fairs, the Civil War veterans were furious to learn the land was to be sold for building lots.

Blasting the "sordid sacrilege," they urged the legislature to buy it and in 1893 the state presented it to the University as a memorial athletic field.

When the question of a name arose, the veterans promptly carried the day for "camp" instead of "Field."

Intercollegiate athetics had been started at Wisconsin in 1881 and the University has had a football team since 1889. The school won its first great victory in 1894, defeating Minnesota 6-0 in a game on the lower campus that part of the crowd watched from fringed surreys. The great teams of '96, '97, and '01 were among the first to play at the new field.

The University had a "real" stadium by 1913 but its stands were still wooden. The legislature declined to pay for concrete—and consequently, was promptly blamed when a large section collapsed Nov. 21, 1915, at the climactic Wisconsin-Minnesota game.

Twenty people were injured, some seriously, and only the fact that the seats fell slowly prevented more casualties among the 1,800 in the area.

So in 1917 the present stadium—following completion of the 1966 addition—was started with a grant of \$15,000 from the legislature. The rest of the money was earned by athletic events and the stadium, which now seats 77,280, is the only one in the Big Ten to "pay its own way" that way. Permanent dormitories were built, housing 150 men, but this space now is used as athletic department offices and training quarters.

The first game to be played in Camp Randall Stadium was the 1917 homecoming game against Minnesota's Golden Gophers. The Badgers won the game 10-7 to hand the Gophers their only Big Ten loss, relegating them to second place in the final conference standings.

The original capacity of the stadium when first utilized in 1917 was 10,000, with permanent seats being added in stages to increase seating capacity.

There have been three enlargements to Camp Randall Stadium since the end of World War II. The first, in 1950 and 1951, saw the completion of the horseshoe at the north end of the stadium.


The running track was eliminated in 1958 expansion which saw the playing field lowered by ten feet to add almost 12,000 seats to the stadium capacity which grew to 63,435 at the time.

The addition of the second deck on the west side of the stadium in 1966 added almost 13,000 prime viewing seats, including the modern Communications Center.

The current capacity of 77,280 makes Camp Randall Stadium the seventh largest college owned stadium in the United States—exceeded only by those at Michigan, Stanford, Ohio State, Tennessee, Penn State, and Georgia.

The fieldhouse at the open end of the stadium horseshoe was built in 1930 for almost \$500,000 and has a seating capacity of 12,204 following renovation in 1976.

### **CAMP RANDALL STADIUM**





### **UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN**

The University of Wisconsin-Madison was established in the same constitutional document which proclaimed Wisconsin's statehood in 1848.

Today, the University of Wisconsin-Madison ranks among the great universities of the world in size, scope, and academic excellence.

In the fall of 1981, 3,979 courses were offered. Majors were available in 152 bachelor's, 187 master's and 118 doctor's degree programs. An array of intellectual experiences are available at the University. For example, UW-Madison has its own nuclear reactor, one of the finest textile collections in the country, a building in which nearly every conceivable environmental condition can be simulated, a collection of more than 1,700 United Artists Corporation movies from 1919 to 1951, and a mastodon skeleton.

Three faculty members have won Nobel Prizes, the most recent being Professor Howard M. Temin, oncologist, who won the 1975 award in medicine. Dr. Joshua Lederberg won the 1958 prize for his studies of the genetic material in bacteria, and Dr. Har Ghobind Khorana was recognized in 1968 for his pioneering work in the field of nucleic acid chemistry.

UW-Madison ranked eighth among the nation's leading institutions in faculty quality in a survey of more than 4,000 professors at four year colleges. UW-Madison departments won a ranking in 12 of the 19 academic fields in a 1977 survey by Evertt C. Ladd Jr., and Seymour Lipset, well-known educational researchers. Results were published in 1979 by the Chronicle of Higher Education.

Highest ranking for UW-Madison were second in agriculture and third in biological sciences. Ranked fourth were foreign languages and sociology. Education and history placed fifth, while chemistry stood sixth and mathematics-statistics seventh. Engineering and political science were rated eighth, economics ninth, and psychology tenth.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top ten educational institutions in the country in every published study of faculty and administrative opinion since the early 1900's.

The American Council on Education ranked the University "distinguished" or strong in 26 of 29 academic disciplines surveyed. Particular praise was given to the departments of chemical engineering, geography, Spanish, botany, history, bacteriology, and bio-chemistry.

The University also ranks high in several other areas: Second nationally in number of doctorates awarded in the past four decades. Second in total expenditures for research and development.

Third in providing federal executives holding doctorates, in total gifts received by state universities, in contributions from business and corporations and in foreign student population.

Fifth in number of full-time students, and seventh among alma maters of presidents serving the nation's largest corporations.

Excellence results from the continued financial support provided by the citizens of Wisconsin, and from the University's dedication to providing maximum educational opportunities for all state citizens, the acquisition of new knowledge through research, and the application of knowledge to the improvement and use of society.
