This is a simple and efficient device for locking up galleys for proofs. It is entirely independent of the galley, and can be locked or unlocked in an instant. It consists of two narrow parallel strips of wood jointed together by spring links and held in position by a rigid cross-bar and a quick thumb screw. These springs adjust themselves to any unevenness there may be in the galley, and permit a snug and perfect lock-up even in an old warped galley without further straining it. NEW CASES.

Attention is called to several new cases which are shown by cuts on the preceding pages, and briefly described below:

The Improved Middletown Job Case, Improved Triple Case and Quadruple Case have 42 instead of 49 boxes in each cap division. This makes the boxes longer. Cases with an irregular number of boxes will not be sent unless specially ordered.

The Middletown Job Case, the New York Job Case, the Paterson Job Case and the Improved two-thirds Yankee Job Case, each will lay a font of caps, small caps, and lower case without mixing. The Quadruple case will lay four cap fonts and the double-Lower case two lower case fonts.

The enlarged German Job Case accommodates all the characters of a German font, caps and lower case, and has near boxes for thin spaces. It was laid out by a skilled German-American printer. It is designed especially for use in cabinets. It is one and one-half times as deep and wide as a regular case, giving it double capacity.

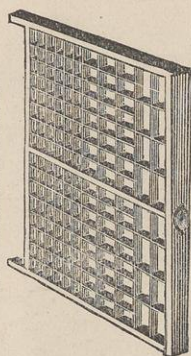
