## STANDARD JOB STICK.



Undoubtedly the best stick now made, entirely original in its action, absolutely correct, and cannot slip.

Printers cannot afford to be without it. It can only be set to picas and nonparells of the standard known as the "American" system, now coming into general use

No quads are needed to set it.

It is graduated, and can be set instantly to any regular measure, and once set it is impossible for it to slip, as it is held by a case-hardened steel pin which extends from the clamp through back of stick into the knee.

Its use will result in a great saving of time and material, as every lead and rule cut for jobs set in it must be on the standard, and no carelessness on the part of compositors in setting sticks can lead to waste of material through cutting irregular measures.

It is a standard gage for cutting material, as every size of the "New American" standard is a multiple of pica. Consider how material is wasted by cutting to irregular measures.

## YANKEE JOB STICK.

Attention is called to several new cases which are shown by cuts on the preceding pages, and briefly described below:

The Improved Middletown Job Case, Improved Triple. Case and Quadruple Case have 42 instead of 49 boxes in each cap division. This makes the boxes longer. Cases with an irregular number of boxes will not be sent unless specially ordered.


The Middletown Job Case, the New York Job Case, the Paterson Job Case and the Improved two-thirds Yankee Job Case, each will lay a font of caps, small caps, and lower case without mixing. The Quadruple case will lay four cap fonts and the double-Lower case two lower case fonts.

The enlarged German Job Case accommodates all the characters of a German font, caps and lower case, and has near boxes for thin spaces. It was laid out by a skilled German-American printer. It is designed especially for use in cabinets. It is one and one-half times as deep and wide as a regular case, giving it double capacity.

The Enlarged Yankee Job Case also has double the capacity of a full-sized Job case. It is intended for the laying of large fonts, which cannot be accommodated by one regular case. Regular pairs, job or half cases, will be made if desired in this size. Length, 32¼ inches; width, 33 inches; boxes 1¼ inches deep.

Our Wood-Type Cases are slotted to picas and supplied with movable strips to form compartments for any size of type. The Mammoth case, which is 23 by 44 inches, has a middle division; the regular wood-type case, which is 23x32½ inches, has none.

The Napanoch and Pine Cabinets have front cross-bars between the cases in the ordinary sizes; the others do not.

In the Napanoch style the body of the cabinet is in ash and the panels and case-fronts are in walnut. It is probably the handsomest printers' cabinet in the market.

## GRAINED CABINET.
