




INTRODUCTION.



March.

The first system of the march section. It features a treble staff with a continuous eighth-note pattern and a bass staff with sustained notes and chords. The music is in common time (4/4) and has a key signature of one sharp (F#).

The second system of the march section. It continues the eighth-note pattern in the treble staff and the harmonic foundation in the bass staff. The key signature remains one sharp (F#) throughout the piece.
