WISCONSIN TOPS IN NATION

1 SOAS

Wisconsin Led the Nation in attendance for the third consecutive year in 1971-72. An all-time collegiate hockey attendance record of 157,142 fans watched 20 home games at the Dane County Coliseum. The average of 7,857 per game was also a new Wisconsin record. Fourteen of the Badgers games were sellouts as Wisconsin played to standing-room-only crowds. For the entire season, 38 games both home and away, the Wisconsin hockey team played in front of 227,523 fans which was another all-time collegiate hockey record.

REVIEW OF THE 1971-72 HOCKEY SEASON

1971-72 WAS WITHOUT A DOUBT THE GREATEST HOCKEY SEASON THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN HAS EVER ENJOYED. IN THEIR SIXTH YEAR UNDER HEAD COACH BOB JOHNSON THE BADGERS SET SCHOOL RECORDS FOR THE HIGHEST FINISH EVER IN WCHA PLAY, MOST VICTORIES IN A SINGLE SEASON, THE LONGEST WINNING STREAK BOTH OVERALL AND IN WCHA PLAY, BROKE ALL EXISTING ATTENDANCE RECORDS, WON THEIR FIRST BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP AND FINISHED THIRD IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT IN BOSTON.

IN ADDITION THE 1971-72 BADGERS SET TWO TEAM RECORDS AND TIED ONE OVERALL AND SET TEN SCHOOL RECORDS FOR WCHA PLAY. INDIVIDU-ALLY ONE OVERALL RECORD WAS BROKEN AND 22 WISCONSIN WCHA RECORDS WERE SET AND THREE OTHERS TIED.

WISCONSIN LED THE WCHA FROM DECEMBER 11, 1971 UNTIL THE FINAL WEEKEND OF THE REGULAR SEASON ON MARCH 3-4, 1972. THEY FINISHED SECOND IN THE CONFERENCE, LOSING THE TITLE TO DENVER ON THE FINAL NIGHT OF THE SEASON. IN SPITE OF THEIR SECOND PLACE FINISH WISCONSIN HAD THE BEST WINNING PERCENTAGE IN THE LEAGUE .714 WITH A 20-8 RECORD BUT FOR THE FIRST TIME IN SEVERAL YEARS THE STANDINGS WERE DETERMINED ON A POINT SYSTEM NOT ON PERCENTAGE.

FROM NOVEMBER 27, 1971 THROUGH JANUARY 1, 1972 THE BADGERS DID NOT LOSE A GAME SETTING SCHOOL RECORDS FOR THE MOST CONSECUTIVE WINS OVERALL (10) AND MOST CONSECUTIVE WINS IN WCHA PLAY (8). THE BADGERS ALSO CAPTURED THE THIRD ANNUAL ST. LOUIS TOURNAMENT FOR THE THIRD CONSECUTIVE YEAR. IN COMPETITION AGAINST OTHER BIG TEN SCHOOLS WISCONSIN HAD AN 8-4 RECORD TO WIN THEIR FIRST BIG TEN HOCKEY TITLE.

THE BADGERS CAME FROM BEHIND IN TWO WCHA PLAYOFF SERIES TO DEFEAT MICHIGAN TECH 9-6 IN TOTAL GOALS AND NORTH DAKOTA 6-2 IN TOTAL GOALS TO WIN THE RIGHT TO ADVANCE TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT IN THE BOSTON GARDEN. IT MARKED THE SECOND TIME IN THE THREE YEARS THAT THE BADGERS HAVE BEEN IN THE WCHA THAT THEY HAVE MADE IT TO THE NCAA TOURNEY. AT BOSTON THEY LOST A SEMI-FINAL GAME TO EVENTUAL NATIONAL CHAMPION BOSTON UNIVERSITY 4-1 BUT CAME BACK IN THE CONSOLATION ROUND TO GAIN REVENGE AGAINST DENVER 5-2 AND TAKE THIRD PLACE IN UNITED STATES COLLEGIATE HOCKEY. THE FINAL COUNT OF 27 WINS TIED WISCONSIN WITH DENVER FOR THE MOST VICTORIES BY A COLLEGIATE TEAM LAST SEASON.

ATTENDANCE RECORDS CONTINUED TO FALL AS WISCONSIN ENJOYED THE GREATEST SUPPORT ANY COLLEGIATE HOCKEY TEAM HAS EVER RECEIVED. IN 20 HOME GAMES THE BADGERS DREW 157,142 FANS, AN ALL-TIME COLLEGIATE ATTENDANCE RECORD BOTH AT WISCONSIN AND IN THE NATION. THE BADGERS AVERAGED 7,857 IN THE 8,000 SEAT DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM AND 14 SELLOUT, STANDING-ROOM-ONLY CROWDS ENABLED WISCONSIN TO LEAD THE NATION IN COLLEGIATE ATTENDANCE FOR THE THIRD CONSECUTIVE YEAR.

SOPHOMORE CENTER GARY WINCHESTER, CALGARY, ALBERTA WAS THE BADGERS LEADING SCORER WITH 52 POINTS AND SENIOR DEFENSEMAN JEFF ROTSCH WAS NAMED TO THE ALL-AMERICAN TEAM. ROTSCH HAILS FROM MINNEA-POLIS, MINN.

Wisconsin's final record of 27-10-1 marked the fifth straight season that the Badgers have won 20 or more games to give coach Bob Johnson a record of 129-64-4 for his six seasons at Wisconsin.

ROBERT N. (BOB) JOHNSON WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

IN THE SIX YEARS BOB JOHNSON HAS BEEN HEAD HOCKEY COACH AT WISCONSIN THE BADGER HOCKEY PROGRAM HAS GROWN BEYOND ANYONE'S WILDEST DREAMS. DURING COACH JOHNSON'S TENURE THE BADGERS HAVE WON 129 GAMES, NEVER HAD A LOSING SEASON, HAVE WON TWENTY OR MORE GAMES FOR THE PAST FIVE YEARS AND LED THE NATION IN ATTENDANCE FOR THE PAST THREE STRAIGHT YEARS.

AFTER THREE YEARS AS AN "INDEPENDENT" IN COLLEGE HOCKEY, JOHNSON'S BADGERS JOINED THE TOUGH WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION (WCHA). THEIR FIRST YEAR IN THE LEAGUE, 1969-70, THE BADGERS SURPRISED THE HOCKEY WORLD BY FINISHING FOURTH (ALL OTHER FIRST YEAR TEAMS FINISHED LAST) AND TOOK THIRD PLACE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT AT LAKE PLACID, N.Y. IN THE 1970-71 SEASON WISCONSIN PLACED EVEN HIGHER IN THE FINAL WCHA STANDINGS BY TAKING THIRD PLACE, AND THIS PAST SEASON, 1971-72 JOHNSON LED HIS BADGERS TO THEIR HIGHEST FINISH, SECOND PLACE, THE BEST WON-LOST PERCENTAGE IN THE ENTIRE LEAGUE AND FOR THE SECOND TIME IN THREE YEARS TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT WHERE AGAIN THE BADGERS FINISHED THIRD.

JOHNSON'S TEAMS HAVE BEEN EXCITING TO WATCH AND THE FANS HAVE RESPONDED IN RECORD NUMBERS. IN THE 1969-70 SEASON WISCONSIN DREW 86,465 IN 13 HOME GAMES. IN 1970-71 THE ATTENDANCE JUMPED TO 109,940 IN 16 HOME GAMES, AND LAST SEASON THE EXCITING BADGERS SET AN ALL-TIME COLLEGIATE ATTENDANCE RECORD BY DRAWING 157,142 IN 20 HOME GAMES DURING THE 1971-72 SEASON.

JOHNSON, 42, IS A NATIVE OF MINNEAPOLIS, MINNESOTA WHERE HE WAS AN ALL-STAR HOCKEY PLAYER AT MINNEAPOLIS CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL AND CAPTAIN IN HIS SENIOR YEAR. HE ALSO EXCELLED IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL.

HE PLAYED COLLEGIATE HOCKEY AT NORTH DAKOTA IN 1950-51 AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA IN 1952-53 AND 1953-54. THE GOPHERS WON THE WCHA TITLE BOTH YEARS JOHNSON PLAYED. HE ALSO LETTERED IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL AT MINNESOTA.

FOLLOWING ARMY DUTY IN KOREA AND A SHORT FLING IN MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL WITH THE CHICAGO WHITE SOX ORGANIZATION, JOHNSON TURNED TO COACHING AND BEGAN HIS CAREER AT WARROAD, MINNESOTA HIGH SCHOOL IN 1956. A YEAR LATER, HE BECAME HEAD COACH AT MINNEAPOLIS ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HIS HOCKEY TEAMS WON 51 OF 60 CONFERENCE GAMES IN 6 SEASONS THROUGH 1962-63.

IN 1963 JOHNSON STARTED A THREE YEAR STINT AS BOTH HOCKEY AND BASEBALL COACH AT COLORADO COLLEGE. HIS HOCKEY TEAMS HAD A COMBINED RECORD OF 29-51-3. IN BASEBALL HE WAS NAMED "COACH OF THE YEAR" FOR THE NCAA COLLEGE DIVISION ROCKY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT IN 1964 AND 1965.

Johnson Received his Bachelor of Science Degree from Minnesota in 1954 with a double major in Physical Education and Social Studies. He gained his Masters in 1961 and his Ph.D in 1963 both from Minnesota in Physical Education. He is currently a full professor of Physical Education at Wisconsin. He is the author of two books, Coaching High School Hockey and Ice Hockey. His unbounding enthusiasm for the game of hockey and his gregarious personality have helped win fans for Wisconsin hockey throughout the State.

ROTHWELL, 34, WAS ASSISTANT HOCKEY COACH AT OHIO STATE UNI-VERSITY FOR THREE YEARS PRIOR TO ACCEPTING THE WISCONSIN JOB. HE HAS A VARIED HOCKEY BACKGROUND WHICH INCLUDED FOUR YEARS OF COMPETITION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, 1964-68, EIGHT YEARS OF PLAY IN AMATUER HOCKEY LEAGUES IN NEW ENGLAND, CANADA AND THE MID-WEST, TWO YEARS OF COMPETITION WITH THE U.S. ARMY HOCKEY TEAM IN EUROPE AND FOUR YEARS OF HIGH SCHOOL HOCKEY IN NEW HAMPSHIRE.

AN ACCOMPLISHED TENNIS PLAYER, ROTHWELL PLAYED FOR THE U.S. ARMY TEAM IN 1956 AND FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TENNIS TEAM IN 1965-68, SERVING AS CAPTAIN IN 1968. IN 1954 WATH A DOUBLE MAJOR IN THYSICAL COUCATION AND DOCIAL STUPIES.
HE CAINED HIS MASTERS IN 1961 AND HIS PH.O IN 1963 BOTH FROM MINNESOTA
IN SHADICAL LOUGATION. HE IS CURRENTLY A FULL PROFESSOR OF PHYSICAL
EDUCATION AT WISCONGIN. HE IS THE AUTHOR OF TWO BOOKS, COACRING DIGG.
SCHOOL HOCKEY AND ISE HOCKEY. HIS UNBOUNDING ENTHUSIAM FOR THE GAME
OF HOCKEY AND HIS GREGARIOUS PERSONALITY HAVE HELPED WIN FANS FOR

WISCONSIN HOCKEY THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

BOR AND RIS VICE PARTHA, ARE THE PARENTS OF FIVE CHILDREN.

- GOALTENDING -- No Doubt our goaltending situation is a Lot better going into this season than a year ago at this time. Jim Makey was a second team All-WCHA performer last season and really carried us through a tremendous month of December where we never Lost a game. Dick Perkins, who was the number one goalie early in the season before his eye injury, came back to give us the 1-2 punch down the stretch and into the playoffs. We also have Doug Spitzig and Doug McFadden and we'll give them a chance to develop. We are very deep in the goalie position.
- DEFENSE -- This is our big question mark. Brian Erickson, AL Folk and Jeff Rotsch are gone and we must replace them. We feel we got a good start with Bob Lundeen and Tom Machowski and we also have veteran Dave Arundel returning. The key of course is the adjustment of our top freshmen hockey players into the WCHA. I think we have three excellent candidates in John Taft, Jack Johnson and Steve Short.
- CENTER -- WE ARE EXTREMELY STRONG AT THIS POSITION. WE HAVE DEAN TALAFOUS COMING BACK AND HE HAD AN OUTSTANDING FRESHMAN YEAR LAST SEASON AND FINISHED THIRD ON OUR TEAM IN SCORING. WE HAVE ALL-NCAA TOURNAMENT PLAYER IN GARY WINCHESTER WHO LED OUR TEAM IN SCORING LAST SEASON.
