Their father was Art Schreiner B. 1876 D.1920 (Evergreen)  
He appears on photo of Hoard's Printers' Picnic held at the  
Fountain House in 1910.(#6)

Geo.Charles\* the same person who appears on several Kunz  
Family photos.(Possibly taken at Kunz' Island at Long Lake,  
WI.Washburn Co.

Marguerite said that her father often drove the City Fire Truck.

He was an excellent cook and especially known for his Potatoe  
Pancakes.

One Photo (Hoard's) shows a Printers' Picnic held at Crab Apple  
Point.(West end of Jones Farm Property).This photo also shows  
one - two bldgs in the background.(A Carp Seiner's loading area.)

Marguerite confirms that many a Fire Dept.Picnic was held at  
Crab Apple Point.

She also states that Miscellaneous Family photos were given  
to the Hoard Museum.
