Vice President Peterson reported on further consideration of the construction of a new dormitory for women on the Chadbourne Hall site. Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was

VOTED, That, as it is the considered opinion of the Regents that a new dormitory for women should be constructed on the site of Chadbourne Hall, the previous action taken by the Regents in this regard be respectfully reiterated to the Governor with an explanation of the need for the dormitory and the reasons for its location; and that the approval of the Governor be requested for the immediate employment of architects and for construction of the dormitory on the Chadbourne Hall site.

President Werner expressed the pleasure of the Board in having the Secretary present after his recent illness; and the Secretary stated that he was happy to be back and expressed his appreciation of the good wishes of the Regents for his recovery.

Regent Gelatt presented the report of the Educational Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Watson, it was VOTED, That the following recommendations of the Educational Committee be adopted:

1. That the resignation of D. Alexander Severino, associate professor of art education, be accepted; to take effect February 1, 1955.
2. That the resignation of John W. Harman, associate professor of pathology, be accepted; to take effect February 15, 1955.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That William S. Middleton, Dean of the School of Medicine, be granted leave of absence, without pay, from March 1, 1955 to March 1, 1956.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Rennebohm, it was  
VOTED, That Walter J. Blaedel, associate professor of chemistry, be  
granted leave of absence, without pay, for the second semester of 1954-55.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Watson, it was  
VOTED, That Otto A. Mortensen, Associate Dean of the Medical School, be  
appointed Acting Dean of the Medical School from March 1, 1955 to June 30, 1955.

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Renk, it was  
VOTED, That I. C. M. Place be appointed associate professor of forestry  
and wildlife management, on the twelve months' basis, beginning July 1, 1955;  
salary at the rate of \$8,500 per annum, charge to the 1955-56 budget.

President Werner stated that the executive session had been recessed until later in this meeting.

Regent Jones presented the report of the Business and Finance Committee.

Following a discussion of the advantages and disadvantages of the Pharmaceutical Gardens area, the Midvale Boulevard area and the Fahrenbrook Court area as sites for married student apartments, and, upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was

VOTED, That, upon recommendation of the University Campus Planning Commission, the Pharmaceutical Gardens area be approved for the site of 100 units of married student apartments.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the action of the Regents on February 6, 1954, approving the plan for landscaping the area between the Memorial Library and the State Historical Society Building, as shown in the sketch identified as Plan 5, be rescinded; and that, upon recommendation of the University Campus Planning Commission, the plan as shown in the sketch identified as Plan B (copy on file), be approved.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a renewal lease with the Wisconsin Tower, Inc., for the second floor of the Wisconsin Tower Building, Milwaukee, for the period July 1, 1955 to June 30, 1956, at an annual rental of \$21,074.90, with an option to extend the lease for one additional year upon ninety days advance notice and with an option to cancel the lease upon ninety days notice.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That the resolutions adopted by the Regents on June 28, 1946, and October 25, 1947, relating to the certification of lists for disbursements from University appropriations and University trust funds be rescinded; and that, in lieu thereof, the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED, That one person shall be required to certify all lists covering disbursements from University appropriations and from University Trust Funds;

AND, that the persons authorized to make such certifications shall be:

I. University Appropriations Disbursements.

- (3) Any member of the Board of Regents, or
- (4) The Controller, or

- (2) The Trust Officer, or
- (3) The Assistant Trust Officer.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the Governor be requested to release \$2200 from the appropriation for remodelling the Home Economics Building for the purpose of providing funds to build a corridor connection between the East Wing and the central hallway area of the center part of the Home Economics Building.

Regent Jones moved and Regent Steiger seconded the adoption of the following recommendation of the Business and Finance Committee:

That, upon the recommendation of the Athletic Board, the price of individual football game tickets be established at \$3.60 effective with the 1955 season.

It was explained that the reason for the proposed increase in the price of football tickets was to bring the prices more nearly in line with other conference schools. A called vote was taken on the above motion - Regents Jones, Renk, Rennebohm, Steiger, Werner voting "Aye", Regent Watson voting "No", and Regent Gelatt refraining from voting. The motion was declared carried.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was VOTED, That subject to the approval of the Governor, which the Regents urge that he grant, the appended resolution marked EXHIBIT "D" relating to acquisition of Federal surplus land in the Camp McCoy-Sparta area for school forest purposes be adopted.

A report was made on behalf of the Special Regent Committee on Agricultural Lands. Regent Rennebohm, reporting on the subject of the sale of the Hill Farms, stated that Professor Ratcliff was now devoting one-half of his time to work on the planning of the sale of the farm lands; and that, although this planning involves much more work than one might think, a great deal of progress has been made. Regent Renk, reporting on the purchase of agricultural lands, stated that the committee and Dean Froker have been working on this matter and hope to be able to report to the Regents at the March meeting regarding the purchase of three parcels of agricultural land.

Regent Watson, on behalf of the Special Regent Committee on the School of Education Deanship, reported that the committee was making progress in cooperation with the administration and the faculty of the School of Education.

Regent Watson suggested that, while President Fred was away receiving an honorary degree at Michigan State College, the Board go on record in expressing pride and admiration for the great credit being brought to this institution by Dr. Fred. Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Gelatt, it was unanimously

VOTED, That this Board go on record expressing its congratulations to President Fred for the honor being conferred upon him by Michigan State College, and expressing appreciation for the outstanding service he has rendered this institution which led to this honor being conferred upon him.

The Board went into executive session at 11:15 A.M.

The Board arose from executive session at 1:40 P.M. and reconvened, with all Regents present as indicated on the original roll call.

President Werner requested the Secretary to present the statement prepared by the Regents in the executive session. The Secretary read the following statement:

"The Regents conferred last week with Governor Kohler and members of his staff and have today conferred with a member of the Governor's staff regarding the problems of higher education in Wisconsin.

"A large majority of this Board believes that the interests of higher education will best be served by continuing separate governing boards for the University and the State Colleges. We recognize the need for cooperative planning. The Board has appointed a committee consisting of Regents Werner, Jones, Steiger and Gelatt to work with the Governor and members of the Legislature in the consideration of any proposed legislation relating to problems of public higher education."

Upon motion of Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was unanimously  
VOTED, That the above statement be approved.

## GIFTS:

- (a) \$ 2,500.00 - Monsanto Chemical Company, St. Louis, Missouri, for the continuation of a graduate fellowship in chemistry for 1955-56. \$1,500 is to be available for the fellow and \$1,000 to the Department of Chemistry for unrestricted use in connection with the fellowship. The donor will also provide funds to pay the necessary fees and tuition. Preference is to be given to a person who is enrolled in the final year of his doctorate and who is majoring in organic chemistry. (15-778)
- (b) - General Electric Company, Schenectady, New York, for the continuation of the General Electric Postgraduate Fellowship in Chemistry for the 1955-56 academic year. The Fellowship will provide funds in the amount of \$1,750 for a single Fellow, \$2,100 for a married Fellow with no dependent children and \$2,500 for a married Fellow with one or more dependent children. An additional amount of \$1,200 will be made to cover tuition and fees and assist in the general support of the research. (15-1148)
- (c) \$ 25.00 - Dr. Norman O. Becker, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin  
25.00 - Dr. Robert F. Schilling, Madison, Wisconsin  
25.00 - Dr. William E. Gilmore, Parkersburg, West Virginia,  
75.00 - to be added to the Robert C. Gavin Memorial Loan Fund for Medical Students. (Student Loan)
- (d) \$ 1,900.00 - Shell Fellowship Committee, New York City, for the continuation of a postgraduate fellowship in Chemical Engineering for 1955-56. Preference in the award of this fellowship shall be given to a student in the last year of his doctorate work, and who is a citizen of the United States or Canada, or to a permanent resident of the United States. The fund is to be expended as follows:
1. \$1,500 to the recipient of the fellowship.
  2. \$ 400 for expenses incidental to the fellowship--any balances to be used at the discretion of the Department of Chemical Engineering.
  3. An additional sum will be provided to pay the tuition and fees for the academic year. (15-368)

The fund is to be expended as follows:

1. \$1,500 to the recipient of the fellowship.
2. \$ 400 for the expenses incidental to the fellowship--any balances to be used at the discretion of the Department of Chemistry.

(h) - Socony-Vacuum Laboratories, Paulsboro, New Jersey, to renew the Socony-Vacuum Fellowship in the Department of Chemistry for 1955-56 under the following conditions:

\$1,750 if the fellow is single, or  
2,250 if the fellow is married, plus  
750 to the department

Preference in awarding the fellowship is to be given to students in the field of organic chemistry. (15-717)

(i) \$ 200.00 - American Foundation for Pharmaceutical Education, New York City, to be added to the Undergraduate Scholarship Fund in the School of Pharmacy. This contribution is provided through the Madison Drug Company, Madison, Wisconsin. (15-655)

(j) \$ 100.00 - Captain Neal R. Kirkpatrick, M. D., APO Seattle, Washington, a contribution to be added to the Medical School Library Building Fund. (Trust)

(k) \$ 1,465.00 - The William Volker Fund, Burlingame, California, a contribution to aid in the expenditures incurred in travel in South America by a Professor of Political Science. The funds shall be used to provide travel to and from and in South America, and to provide for a per diem allowance of \$15. (15-242)

(l) \$ 25.00 - An anonymous contribution to the University of Wisconsin to be used by the Dean of the Law School in his discretion, in support of the Law School research program. (15-3)

- (m) \$ 25.00 - Mrs. Anne Steytler, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, a contribution to be added to the David Stimple Memorial Scholarship Fund. (Trust)
- (n) \$ 4,000.00 - University of Wisconsin Foundation, a gift from Smith-Douglass Company, Inc., Norfolk, Virginia, to establish the "Smith-Douglass Company, Inc. Agricultural Scholarships." Two scholarships of \$400 each are to be awarded to incoming freshmen in the 1955-56 academic year and two scholarships of \$400 each will be awarded to incoming freshmen in the 1956-57 academic year. The scholarships may be continued in the amount of \$200 per year during the recipients' sophomore, junior, and senior year if they remain eligible. Selection of the scholars shall be by the Loans, Fellowships and Scholarships Committee of the College of Agriculture on the basis of: Scholarship - 40%, Need - 25%, Worth - 20%, and FFA Activities - 15%; and upon receipt of recommendations for the candidates from, (a) the principal of the high school from which the candidate graduated, (b) the teacher of agriculture, (c) the state FFA advisor, and (d) one other person. Any income accruing to the account or unexpended balances may be used for additional scholarships or for increasing the amount of scholarships awarded. (Trust)

- (o) \$ 3,556.85 - The University of Wisconsin Foundation, a contribution from the Edward Alsworth Ross Memorial Fund Committee for the establishment of the Edward Alsworth Ross Memorial Fund. The principal of this fund is to be forever held in trust with the income of the fund to be used for grants to or for graduate students in Sociology in residence at the University of Wisconsin, preferably to aid them in the completion of doctoral dissertations, and that awards be made from time to time by the Executive Committee of the Department of Sociology and Anthropology of the University of Wisconsin, or by such group or committee as in the judgment of the Regents of the University of Wisconsin shall be most nearly clothed with and exercising the powers and functions of the said Committee as they now exist.
