Trombone is played by Raymond Leloin, electric guitar by Gino Johnson, accordion by Ole Thompson and the drums by Sherman Hoiberg. These boys are all local talent and very good too. Raymond Leloin is a farmer northeast of McVille and he plays a variety of instruments. He's very good on the trumpet. Gino Johnson that plays the guitar, he lives up near Lakota. Ole Thompson is a carpenter. He lives in McVille and he lives only about a half a block north of my brother-in-law, Louie Sigetti (sp.) Sherman Hoiberg, that plays drums, he's a farmer, he has a farm down by the Sheyenne River south of McVille.

I'm sure glad we took our tape recorder downtown last night because I didn't know these guys before but I know them now. And we had a very enjoyable time. It's about seven years ago since we were up here to McVille so we're going to make the best of it this time that's for sure.
