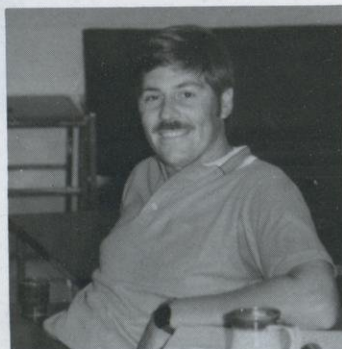
Terry Bahr has taught English here for 12 years. He, too, had previous experience, having taught in Warren, Illinois after graduating from Whitewater.

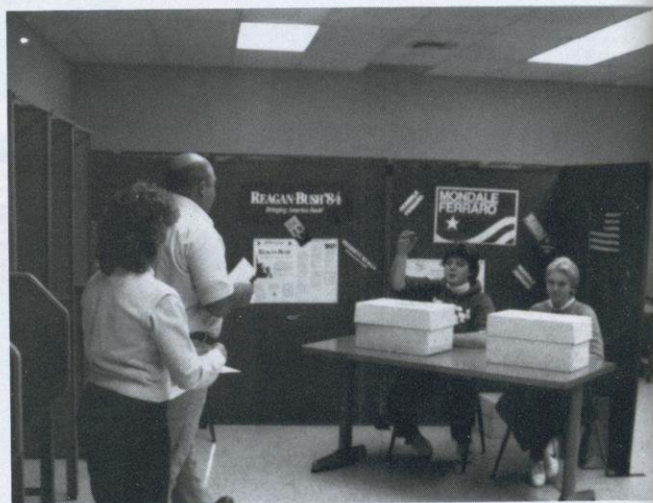
# Once Every Four Years . . .



What happens every four years? Leap year, the Olympics, and the presidential elections, of course! 1984 was the year for all these events, and WHS students and faculty had the opportunity to participate in the voting on Election Day.

The Republican party chose Ronald Reagan and George Bush against Democrats Walter Mondale and Geraldine Ferraro. This was the first time ever that a woman had been nominated by her party for a high-ranking national office.

Students in Mrs. Ebert's classes organized and ran the WHS election. Those involved were Tammie and Stacie Hewitt, Leandro Torres, and Kim Tretow. Sue Biermann and other students from Mr. Edwards' Social Studies classes also helped



"at the polls." As the student body reported to A-137 that day, everyone first had to register to vote. Class lists were used so that it would not be possible for anyone to vote twice. Official "sample" ballots were used by all voters and then deposited in the election boxes. By the end of the day, over 59% of the student body had overwhelmingly re-elected Reagan-Bush. The opinion paralleled that of the country as a whole. The Republican ticket won all but 13 electoral votes and 59% of the popular vote.

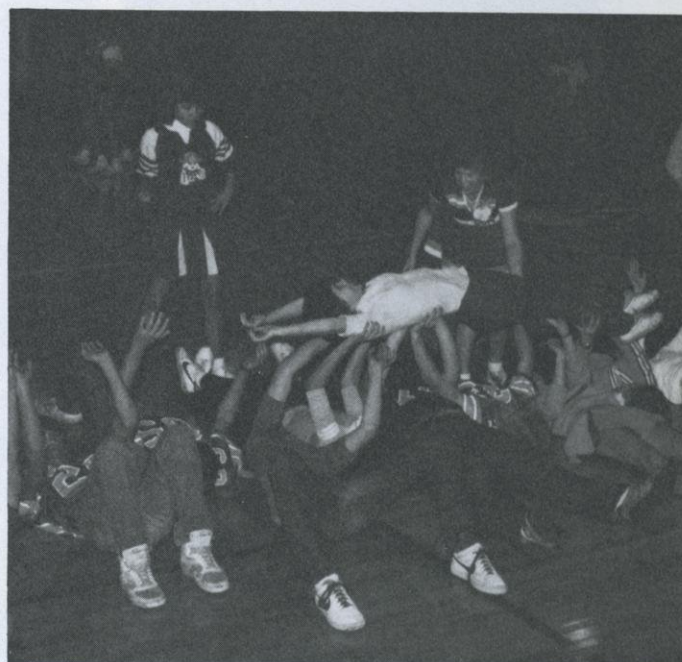
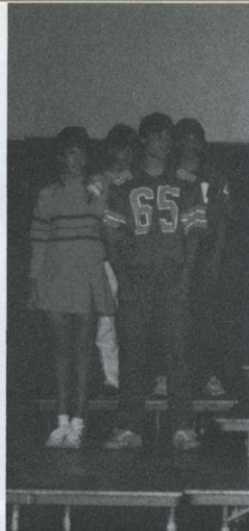




# P e p R a l l y
