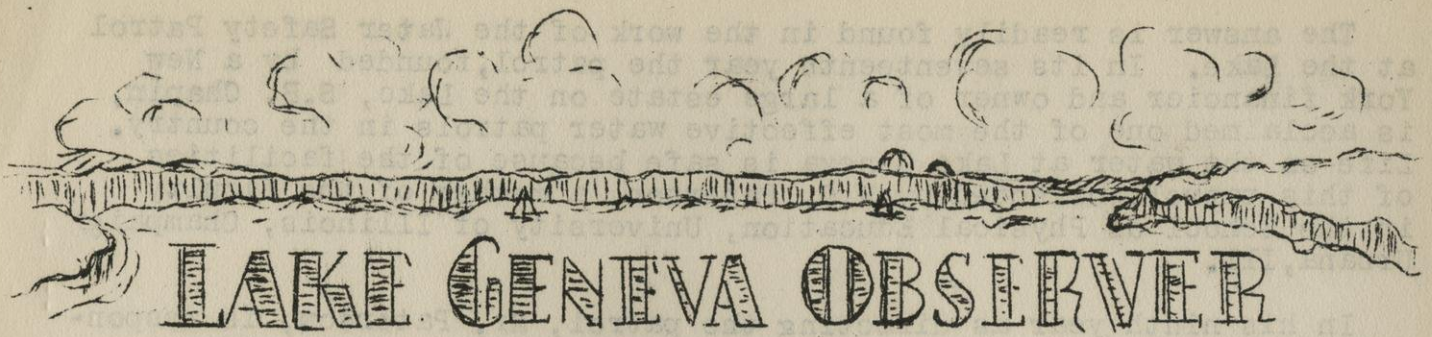

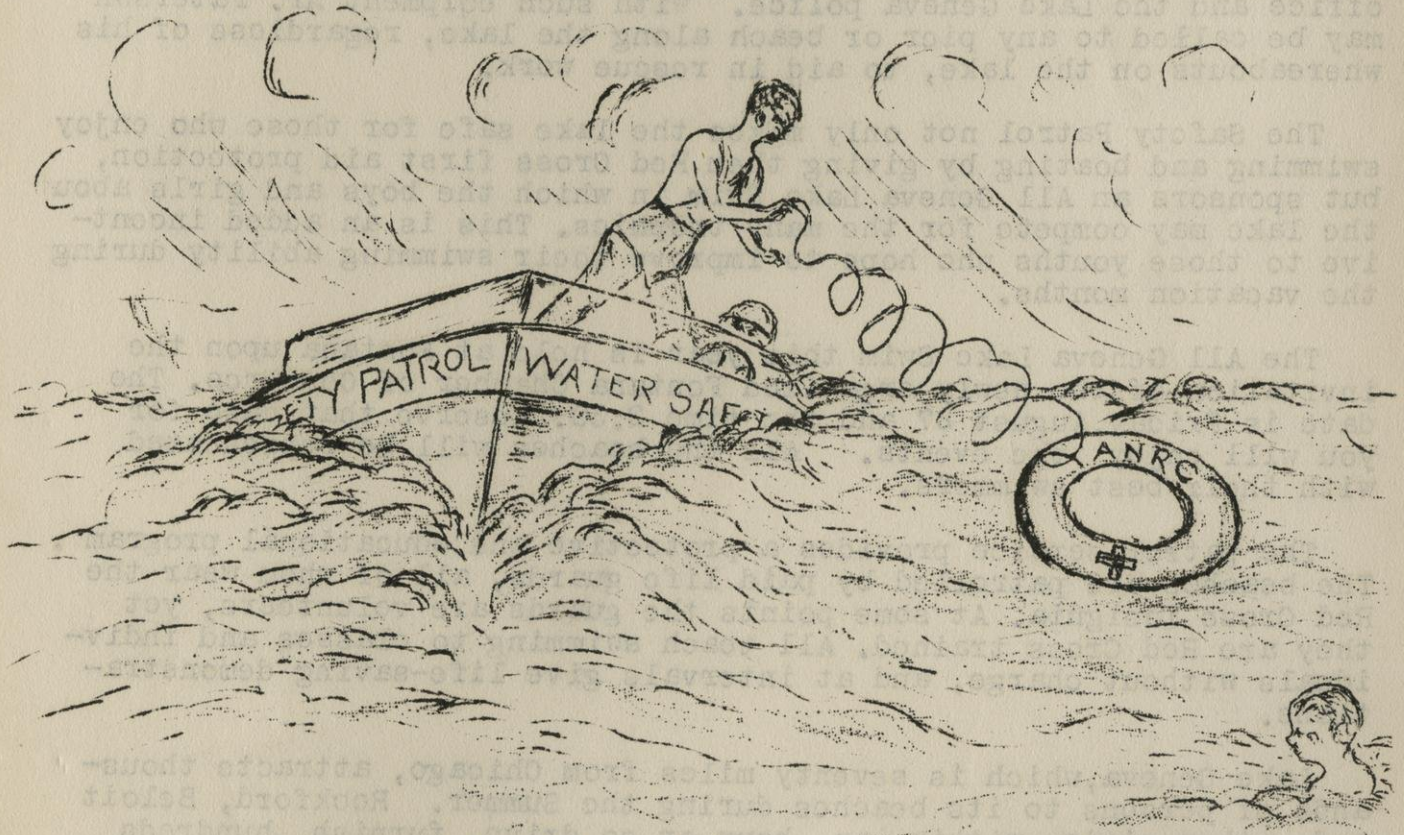

## WHY IS LAKE GENEVA ONE OF THE SAFEST INLAND LAKE RESORTS AT WHICH TO VACATION?

The answer is readily found in the work of the Water Safety Patrol at the Lake. In its seventeenth year the patrol, founded by a New York financier and owner of a large estate on the Lake, S.B. Chapin, is acclaimed one of the most effective water patrols in the country. Life on the water at Lake Geneva is safe because of the facilities of this patrol, directed by H.C. Paterson, a member of the faculty in the School of Physical Education, University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana, Ill.

In his ninth year as directing the patrol, Mr. Paterson, is responsible for 220 piers, four city and village beaches, eight camps. In fact he directs the water patrol of the 29 miles of shore line.

Early this Summer a Gar Wood speed boat was added to the patrol equipment, as a gift of the many supporters and enthusiasts of this great system. No other inland lake has a boat so equipped for rescue and resuscitating work as this now manned under the direction of Mr. Paterson. It is equipped with a radio transmitter and receiver, as a part of the radio set up of Walworth County Sheriff's office and the Lake Geneva police. With such equipment Mr. Paterson may be called to any pier or beach along the lake, regardless of his whereabouts on the lake, to aid in rescue work.

The Safety Patrol not only makes the lake safe for those who enjoy swimming and boating by giving them Red Cross first aid protection, but sponsors an All Geneva Lake Swim in which the boys and girls about the lake may compete for the many trophies. This is an added incentive to those youths who hope to improve their swimming ability during the vacation months.

The All Geneva Lake Swim this year is held at Fontana upon the invitation of the newly organized Fontana Chamber of Commerce. The date is Friday, August 27 and the time 2.30. Reserve that date for you will enjoy the events. All the beaches will be represented with their best swimmers.

The patrol service provides a protective and educational program. The beaches are patrolled by paid life guards, all of whom wear the Red Cross insignia. At some points the guards are volunteers, yet they are Red Cross trained. All teach swimming to classes and individuals without charge, and at intervals give life-saving demonstrations.

Lake Geneva, which is seventy miles from Chicago, attracts thousands of persons to its beaches during the Summer. Rockford, Beloit and other cities within an hour or so drive, furnish hundreds of bathers especially over week ends. More and more these and the vacationer are seeking the spot where there is protection such as can be found at Lake Geneva, through the complete facilities of the Water Safety Patrol.

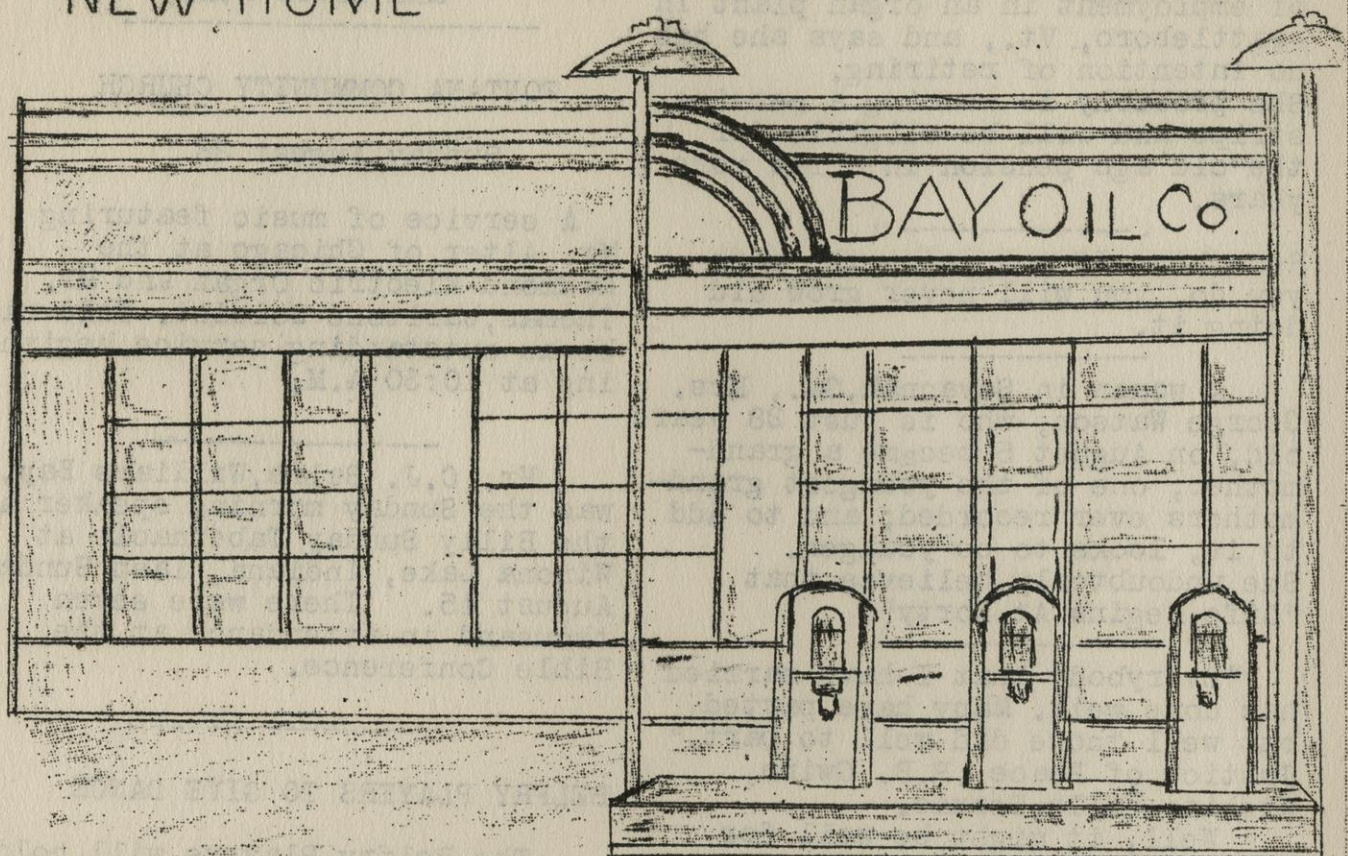

Bob is well known because of his interest in swimming at our beach, helping out in many of the Bay's competitive events.

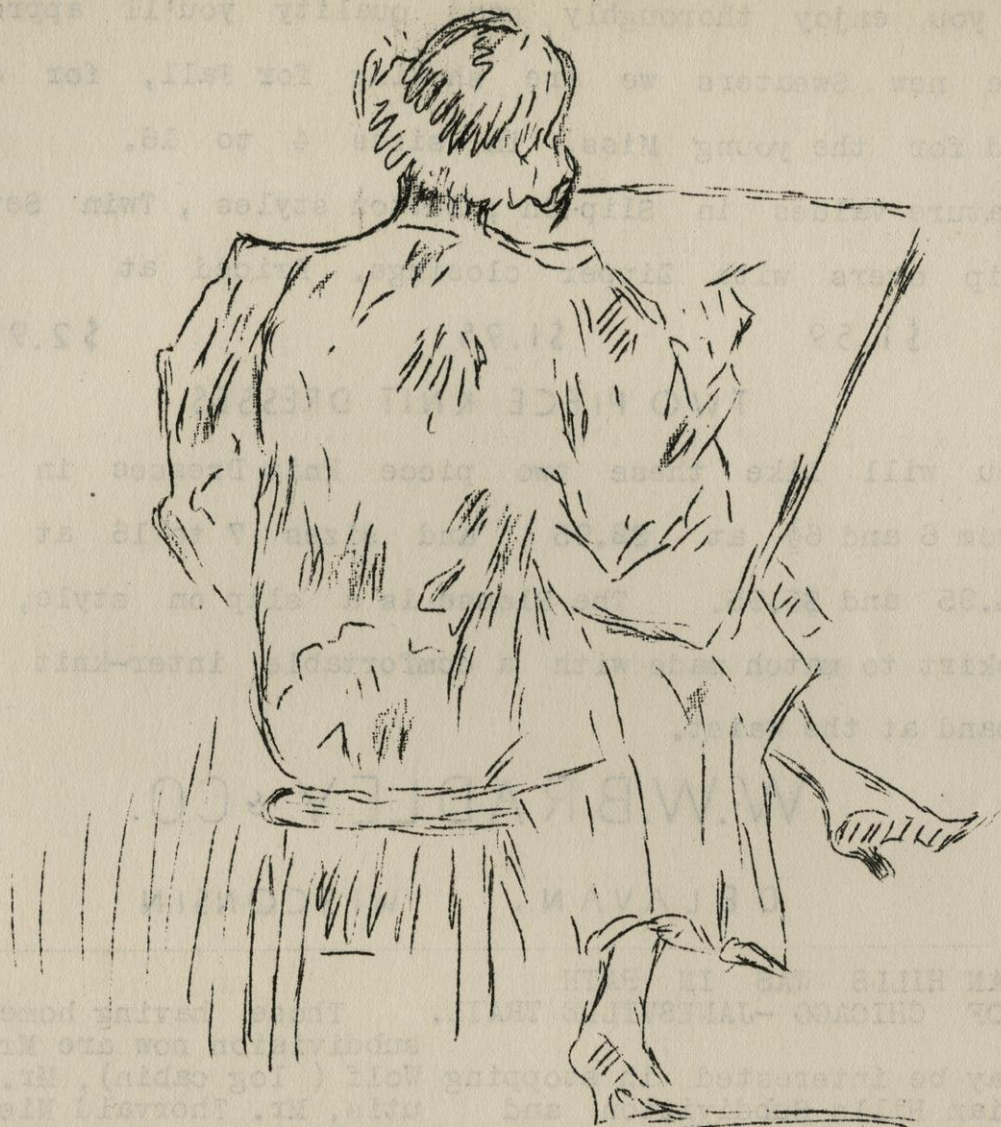

### INDIAN HILLS WAS IN PATH OF CHICAGO -JANESVILLE TRAIL.

Our Safety Patrol boat is now  
operating on the lake, ready for  
every emergency. It is equipped with  
(1) the latest and best resucitator  
and inhalator, (2) a complete first  
aid kit, (3) stretcher, dragline  
and water scope, (4) a radio receiv-  
ing set which is connected with the  
County Sheriff's hook up and which  
will bring to the patrol an immedi-  
ate report of accidents on the lake

Our new equipment will greatly  
increase our efficiency this seas-  
on. Last season our 42 life guards  
at 12 different stations taught  
860 beginners to swim and 1921 were  
benefitted by instruction, 737 per-  
sons passed life saving tests, 562  
persons received first aid and 99  
were rescued from possible drown-  
ing. There were no fatalities.

GENEVA LAST FRIDAY AND SATURDAY

The Lake Geneva Garden Club's 33rd annual show held last Friday and Saturday at Horticultural Hall was indeed a grand affair. There was a wealth of flowers, fruits and vegetables together with a display of dairy products, all from the fertile soil of Wisconsin.

Mrs. William Nelson Pelouze and her committee introduced a number of innovations this year which added greatly to the beauty of the show.

The main hall was transformed into a brilliant flower garden with beds of massed cut flowers hedged in by walls of arbor vitae. The large bed of zinnias and marigolds, of Mrs. Daniel Peterkin's, won her the blue ribbon. Mrs. Robert Tarrant's white sculptured figures of a girl and a faun lent beauty and grace to the pool by which they stood edged with African violets against a green background.

The exhibits of vegetables, which was one of the finest ever shown, owing to the splendid growing weather this season.

Miss Eugenie Smith's shadow box depicting a country scene of her native Russia, attracted much attention. A little path led up to a tiny peasant house of celery with a roof of onion tops, past a well of miniature corn ears with a radish bucket. Others winning prizes in this class were, Miss Ruth Jaffrs of Janesville and Mrs. Earle J. Zimmerman.

Mrs. Bartholomay Osborne won two prizes for shadow box arrangements, one of grapes, winning a first place and another with a butterfly resting on white cosmos.

Mrs. M.A. Ryerson, Mrs. H. Bartholomay and Mrs. O.L. Schmidt were among the prize winners in the main hall.

In the Wychwood display, arranged as a memorial to the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles L. Hutchinson, were red and white rubrum, Queen Anne's lace, cat tails, a dozen or more varieties of ferns and many other choice specimens of wild flowers.

A display of artistic talent was shown in the decorations of tables and breakfast trays.

Mrs. Robert Tarrant won first with a luncheon table set with white Spode, emerald green glass and a large white boat of white petunias.

Mrs. H.H. Porter won second with her fish dinner table, using a net as a cover, silver sailboats as the centerpiece and table service in fish shapes.

The Bartholomay-Schmidt, A.H. Wakeley, A.H. Madlener, Daniel Peterkin and T.J. Lefens estates had especially fine displays of vegetables and fruits. Jerseyhurst taking first place with white and purple grapes, and Bartholomay-Schmidt's first with red grapes.

The door prize, two selections of delphiniums, were won by Mrs. P.M. Russell, Chicago and Mrs. F. Test, Elgin Club.

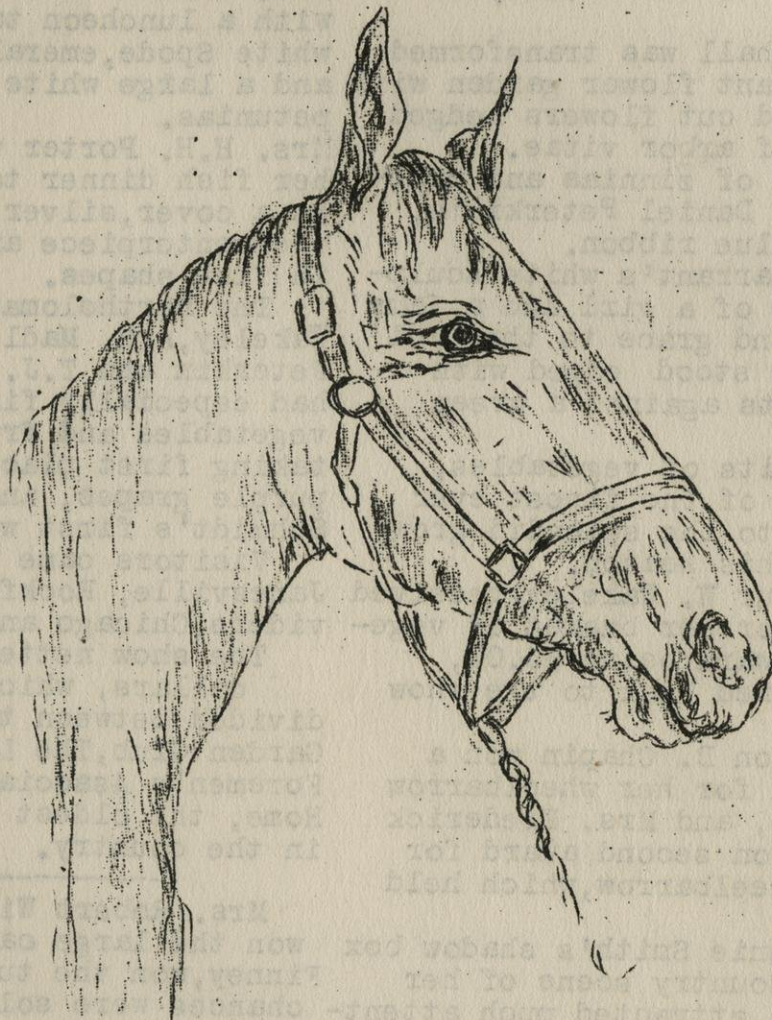
