Church

When the Oneidas arrived here, they built a church. It was just made of logs and then they were able to build on in the white fashion and that was 99 years ago. They did a lot of work on it and then they wanted to build another one when they had lime and hewn logs. He had become entirely damaged and they chose to build one of stone. They had \$3,000 when a bank lost the Oneida's money. These Oneidas didn't give up. They then began to quarry stone. The old men had worked quite a bit and there are still a few who remain among those who had quarried stone. Good people sent us a lot of money and they helped us put up a stone church. Our priest gave one sermon and then got sick and died. It is 55 years since we built the stone church.
