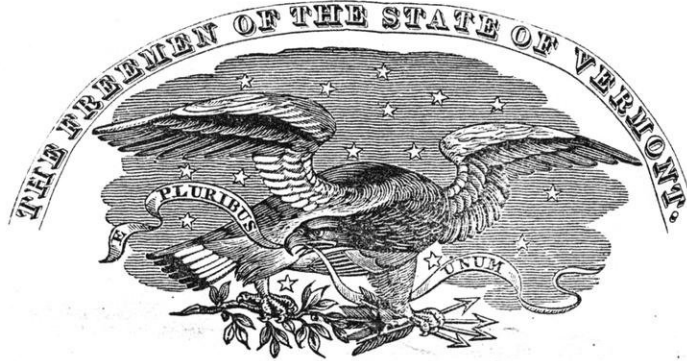

You being appointed Adjutant of the Eleventh Regiment *Greeding.*

of the Militia of this State, and reposing special trust and confidence in your patriotism, valour and good conduct,—I do, by virtue of these presents, in the name and by the authority of the Freemen of the State of Vermont, fully authorize and empower you the said Henry S. Eggleston to take charge of the said Regiment as their Adjutant

You will, therefore, carefully and diligently discharge the said duty, by doing and performing every matter and thing thereunto relating. You will observe and follow such orders and directions as you shall from time to time, receive from the Commander in Chief, for the time being, or any other your superior Officer, according to military discipline and the laws of this State. And all officers and soldiers under your command are to take notice hereof, and yield due obedience to your orders, as their Adjutant in pursuance of the trust in you reposed.

In testimony whereof, I have caused the seal of this state to be hereunto affixed.

in the Year of our Lord Christ; One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty Nine and of
the independence of the United States the sixty third.

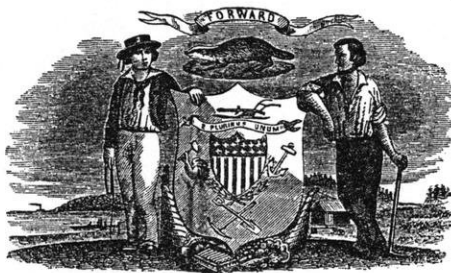

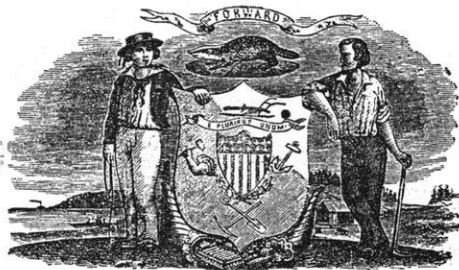

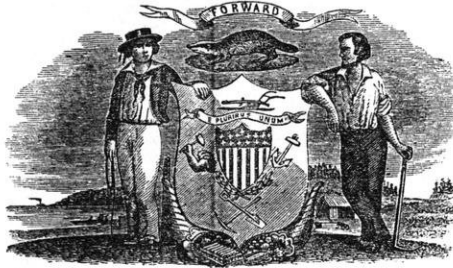
