



# GUY M. SUNDT Athletic Director

GUY M. SUNDT, present director of athletics at the University of Wisconsin, merits all the honors bestowed upon him.

Back in the fall of 1918, he enrolled at Wisconsin and, because World War I brought about freshman competition, he was a member of the Badger varsity football team almost immediately. His performance was so outstanding that he was elected captain for the 1919 season.

Then came the Armistice and Charles "Chuck" Carpenter, who had been elected 1918 captain but who entered the service before he could assume those responsibilities, returned to the campus.

Sundt gracefully and quietly stepped down and Carpenter took over the leadership of the team.

That single act was typical of Guy Sundt and down through the years since, he has won the admiration and respect of all his co-workers, friends, contestants, officials, and contemporaries because of his steadfast loyalty to Wisconsin and his fine sense of values.

All of this culminated in his being named to succeed Harry Stuhldreher as athletic director when the latter resigned Oct. 1, 1950.

Guy Sund was born in Madison, Wis., on Feb. 18, 1898. He starred as an all-around athlete in Stoughton high school. He enrolled at Wisconsin in the fall of 1918 graduated in 1922.

While at Wisconsin, he won eight major sports letters. Four of them were in football, three more in track, and one in basketball, earning the latter in his only year of competition in that sport.

As a hard-driving fullback and outstanding punter on the varsity football teams coached by Guy Lowman and John Richard, Sundt received All-American honorable mention by the late Walter Camp in 1921 and was Walter Eckersall's first choice as All-Western Conference player that same season. He captained the team in 1921 and also was voted the most valuable player. He was senior class president.

In track, he competed in the weights and broad jump, ranking high in the Big Ten meets.


Following his graduation as president of his 1922 class, he became athletic director and coached football, basketball, and track at Ripon College for two years. In the fall of 1924 he returned to Wisconsin as freshman football and basketball coach, assistant track coach, and instructor in physical education.

Since that time he has been associated with the department of intercollegiate athletics in either a coaching or directing capacity. He was varsity backfield coach and chief scout in football (1924-1948) assistant track and cross country coach (1924-58 head track and cross country coach (1948-50) freshman baseball coach (1925-26) freshman basketball coach (1924-1929) and assistant athletic director (1936-1950).

In addition, he managed the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association state basketball tournaments and track meets since 1925 along with several state prep swimming and skating meets. He has been secretary of the Alumni Association board of directors.

He made his debut as head cross country coach in the fall of 1948 by winning the Western Conference championship and his charges repeated that title success the next season (1949). His indoor track team shared the Big Ten crown in 1949 with Ohio State.

Sundt is married, has two daughters, Mrs. Deane Page, 28, and Ann, 17.

# IVAN B. WILLIAMSON Head Football Coach

 $T^{\rm WENTIETH~coach~to~guide~football~fortunes~at~the}_{\rm University~of~Wisconsin~is~Ivan~B.~{\rm ``Ivy''~Wil-}}$ liamson and, in just four years, he has established himself the most successful in the modern era.

Ivy took over at Wisconsin in the spring of 1949. succeeding Harry Stuhldreher and his record has been terrific. For the first three seasons (1949-1950-1951) he had the Badger eleven in title contention and Rose Bowl consideration right up to the final gun in November, and last year, his charges hit the top by tying Purdue for the Big Ten championship (first since 1912 for Wisconsin) and then representing the Western Conference in the Rose Bowl game.

Ivy's record of 17 victories, three ties, and six defeats in four seasons of Big Ten competition is the best of any school in the Big Ten for the past four years. His overall record of 24 wins, 10 defeats (including the 7-0 loss to Southern California New Year's Day), and three deadlocks easily is the best of any Wisconsin coach since the days of John Richards

more than three decades ago.

Williamson assumed the head coaching reins at Wisconsin with an excellent background. He played football at Michigan during the seasons of 1930, 1931, and 1932, rated All Conference end, and was captain in his senior year. During that period, Michigan won three Western Conference championships and lost only one

game while winning 24 and tying two.

At Michigan, "Ivy" also earned two basketball letters and his football coach, at that time, Harry Kipke, said "Ivan Williamson is the smartest player I have ever had or hope to have." When Williamson was named to the Wisconsin coaching spot, Kipke, now a business executive in Detroit, repeated that original statement and then added "As a player, Ivy was a standout. In his senior year when he played under the handicap of a bad knee, he wasn't stopped and he proved himself a great player and competitor."

Before coming to Wisconsin, Williamson was head coach for two seasons at Lafayette College. His 1947 team won six games and lost three, while, in 1948, his charges won seven games out of nine, bowing

only to Army and Rutgers.

Born in Prairie Depot, Ohio (now called Wayne), on Feb. 4, 1911, Williamson was graduated from Bowling Green high school after excelling in both scholarship and athletics. He entered Michigan and upon his graduation had not only won laurels as one of the outstanding athletes in Wolverine history but wound up with special honors in scholarship. He also holds a master's degree from Michigan, obtained in 1940. He is married and has twin sons, Jack and David, age 15.
Following his graduation in the spring of 1933,


Williamson coached football and basketball at Roseville, Mich., high school, producing an unbeaten eleven. In the spring of 1934, he accepted a position as assistant coach on the Yale football staff, serving there under Raymond "Ducky" Pond through 1940, and

under Emerson "Spike" Nelson in 1941.

In June of 1942, he entered the Navy and put in a season of coaching under Potsy Clark at Pensacola, Fla., Navy base. His war-time service also included duties at the naval station in Sanford, Fla. the Gunnery school at Hollywood, Fla. the Cadet Selection board at Detroit, Mich. and the training carrier, USS Wolverine, Chicago.

After his discharge in 1945, he resumed his former football duties at Yale, this time assisting Howie Odell. He left there in 1947 to take over head coaching

duties at Lafayette.



A stickler for fundamentals and organization, "Ivy" promises sound strategy and daring tactics in his outline for winning football. He introduced his version of the T-formation mhich faintly resembles the "T" as used at Yale, and employed the two-platoon system of offensive and defensive units the past two seasons.


# University of Wisconsin

COACH OF LINE — MILTON BRUHN
Birthdate: July 28, 1912

MILTON BRUHN, who was Williamson's assistant in 1947 and 1948 while at Lafayette College, is a graduate of the University of Minnesota and an outstanding athlete. Born in St. Bonisacius, Minn., 40 years ago, he attended high school at Mound, Minn., and starred in both baseball and football. He enrolled at the University of Minnesota in 1932 and won letters in both of his favorite sports. He was left guard on the Gopher eleven which won conference championships in 1934 and 1935 and which went unbeaten for two seasons. He also played on the baseball team which won the Big Ten championship in the 1935 campaign. Milt was a catcher on the nine and also captained the team in his senior year. Following his graduation with a B.S. degree in the spring of 1936, he joined the football coaching staff at Amherst College, then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for the season of 1943. He was at Colgate University in 1944 and 1945, and at Franklin & Marshall College in 1946 as an assistant. Then he joined forces with Williamson when the latter became head coach at Lafayette in 1947. Milt is married and has two children, Peter and Mary Anne.

# COACH OF BACKFIELD — ROBERT ODELL Birthdate: March 5, 1922

Youngest Member of the Wisconsin football coaching staff is Robert Odell who is 31 years of age. Bob was an All-American football player at the University of Pennsylvania from which he graduated in 1943 with a B.A. degree. He was born in Corning, Iowa, then moved to Sioux City where he competed in sports during his high school days at East. He was All-State halfback and a state champion hurdler. He entered Pennsylvania in the fall of 1939 and was a varsity halfback for three seasons. For his standout performance in the 1942 season when he attained All-American ranking, he was voted the winner of the Maxwell award which is similar to the Heisman award for "Football Player of the Year." After his graduation he was communications officer in the Navy from 1943 to 1946, then came to Yale University as an assistant coach under his brother, Howard, for the seasons of 1946 and 1947. He shifted to Temple University as assistant coach for the 1948 season and in February, 1949, came to Wisconsin to serve under Williamson. He is married and has one son, Robert, and two daughters, Nancy and Cynthia.



# FRESHMAN FOOTBALL COACH — GEORGE LANPHEAR Birthdate: March 22, 1913

EORGE LANPHEAK, energetic and congenial assistant to Head Coach Ivy Williamson, became a member of the athletic department in the fall of 1947, following success as head football coach and football assistant at Ripon College. George, who is more familiarly known as "Muscles," starred in all sports at Beloit high school and later at Wisconsin, winning letters in football, basketball, and baseball before his graduation in 1938. He served as an assistant football coach during his senior year since his intercollegiate competition had been cut short because he had enrolled at Beloit College for one semester. George moved to Ripon College as head basketball coach and football assistant in 1939 and during the summer of 1940 he returned to Wisconsin to complete his studies for a master's degree. When he left Ripon College for Wisconsin in 1947, he was appointed freshman football coach, a position he held until the appointment of Ivy Williamson as varsity coach. Now Lanphear's title is that of freshman coach, Among his other athletic accomplishments, he played baseball with the Madison Blues, semi-pro nine, and also toured with the House of David baseball team. He played one season of pro basketball with the Flint (Mich.) Buicks. He is married and has three sons, Dan, Charles, and Phillip.

# **Assistant Coaches**

COACH OF ENDS — PAUL R. SHAW Birthdate: Nov. 3, 1914

PAUL R. He was born in Bradford, Pa., attending high school there and starred in sports. At Pittsburgh, he competed in football as an end when the Panthers were a gridiron power. Following his graduation, he assisted in coaching at Hazelton (Pa.) high school from 1938 to 1941, then entered the service and was a first lieutenant in the Army Air Corps from 1942 to his discharge in July, 1946. He was appointed end coach at Lafayette in September of 1946 and since then has been assistant to Williamson. Paul is married, and has one daughter, Deborah.





# JUNIOR VARSITY COACH AND HEAD SCOUT—FRED E. MARSH Birthdate: Aug. 24, 1910

FOURTH of the new assistant coaches who joined the Wisconsin football staff with the advent of Ivy Williamson as head mentor is Fred Marsh, a lifelong friend of the new Badger coach. Fred is 42 years of age, was born in Bowling Green, Ohio, and attended the same high school as Williamson. He captained the cagers in 1928, his senior year. Upon graduation, Fred enrolled at Denison University at Granville, Ohio, but two years later transferred to Bowling Green University, graduating with a B.S. degree in education in 1933. He played two seasons of football at Denison and two more at Bowling Green as a guard, being selected on All-Ohio honorary teams. He also played on the Bowling Green cage teams. Following graduation, he remained at his alma mater as freshman football coach and in 1934 took over duties as director of health and physical education at Bowling Green high school, also acting as football and basketball coach. He received his master's degree as assistant football coach. He was in the Navy from 1942 to 1946, then was assistant athletic director and freshman coach in both football and basketball at Bowling Green. He is married and has two daughters, Marilyn Lee and Melinda Sue.



# VERN WOODWARD FROSH ASSISTANT Birthdate: Sept. 15, 1909

Vern Woodward, assistant boxing coach, also has been a member of the football staff for several years, aiding in the tutelage of freshmen candidates. Woodward attended River Falls State Teachers, then matriculated to Wisconsin to win a major letter as a heavyweight boxer in 1936 and 1937. He was appointed assistant to Boxing Coach Walsh upon graduation and held that

upon graduation and held that position until he entered the Navy physical training program in 1942. He spent five years in the Navy, attaining the rank of Lieut. Commander. During Navy duty he coached the boxing teams of Pensacola, Bunker Hills, and Iowa Seahawks. He returned to Wisconsin in 1947 as boxing assistant and at that time was named to the football coaching staff. Woodward is married, and has two daughters.

# Laverne van Dyke JV Assistant Birthdate: Oct. 20, 1916

LaVerne Van Dyke was appointed a graduate assistant coaching on the football staff in the fall of 1949. Van Dyke is a graduate of Kimberly high school and played four years as halfback and end under Coach Eddie Katal at Stevens Point State Teachers College. Prior to entering the service in 1942, Van Dyke coached at Waupaca high school and after his Army hitch he re-

and after his Army hitch, he returned to Wisconsin in September, 1949, to work on his master's degree. He is married, but has no children.

Tom Bennett, cross country and track assistant, also will be included on the frosh football staff. He won letters as an end on the 1946-47-48 elevens.

# PROSPECTS IN FOOTBALL FOR 1953

If the two-platoon system still were in effect, Coach Ivy Williamson's football program at the University of Wisconsin simply would be one of replacement for the 1953 season.

His job then would be to replace six out of seven starters in the offensive line, none whatever in the backfield. Defensively, he would have to fill gaps at two tackles, center, guard, right side linebacker, two defensive halfbacks, and a safetyman.

And by-and-large, Ivy could muster replacements who by mid-season, could approximate the level of

efficiency attained in 1952.

But the new rules which virtually erase the twoplatoon method of gridiron operation propose the difficult change-over to a "double-duty" unit within a very much limited (by comparison) time period of preparation.

Graduation took 18 lettermen while Paul Schwaiko, sophomore defensive halfback is ineligible scolasti-

cally.

From last year's first string offensive unit, Williamson has returning only Clarence Stensby, right guard, from the line, while Jim Haluska, quarterback Harland Carl, left halfback Jerry Witt, right halfback; and Alan Ameche, fullback, form a veteran and intact backfield.

Back from the defensive line are the fine ends, Don Voss (Football Writers Association All-American selection) and Jerry Wuhrman (co-captain). From the linebacker trio, two return, Co-captain Roger Dornburg and John Dixon.

At least that's what a perusal of the listed assets on

the football ledger leads one to believe.

However, a physical inventory raises some serious doubts and it appears that graduation losses aren't the only setbacks to Ivy's 1953 plans.

The old bugaboo—football knee—may deprive the Badgers of the two ends, Voss and Wuhrmann, and the halfback, Carl. Haluska broke his leg while playing summer baseball.

Voss did not report to spring practice because of an impending operation on the knee he injured in the Rose Bowl game. The operation, however, was postponed and current medical advice is not encouraging as to the availability of the crack wingman.

Carl and Wuhrmann sustained injuries in the spring drills. Carl, whose career has been studded with "hard luck" injuries, twisted his knee the first day of spring practice, returned a few weeks later only to re-injure the knee. Wuhrmann sustained a knee injury late in the spring drills and recently underwent an operation.

"It would be a minor miracle if Haluska is available at the start of the season," Williamson has said.

The availability of these proven veterans still is very much in doubt.

All told, Ivy has 16 major lettermen left from last year's co-championship Big Ten team. To this, he can add 22 winners of junior "W" awards with eight freshman numeral winners who, in Ivy's opinion, can be classed with the varsity squad. Other candidates, until proven, will be with the junior varsity squad.

Nine of the major lettermen already have been listed. The others available include Tom Canny, hard running halfback Norb Esser and James Temp, ends Wendell Gulseth, tackle and regular punter Mark Hoegh, tackle Ronnie Locklin, defensive halfback and Don Ursin, tackle. All of these saw considerable duty in the latter part of the season and especially in the Rose Bowl

Of the junior "W" men returning, Gary Messner, center; Ronald Roberts, guard, and Gust Vergetis, quarterback, are dead certain to be among the first 22 on the firing line this fall.

Highly regarded recruits from the frosh ranks are Charles Thomas, fullback Jim Miller and Jack Stellick, quarterbacks Dick Kolian, halfback Bob Konovsky, end; and John Dittrich, guard.

Spring drills brought much more satisfaction than was expected, especially in the limited time available to "change over" specialists into two-way workmen. Most notable of the shifts found Linebacker John Dixon shifted to left guard, Guard Clary Stensby to left tackle and Linebacker Roger Dornburg to a left halfback spot, although in the latter's case, he had performed at that post several times during the 1952 season and for several plays in the Rose Bowl.

If Ivy were to name a starting lineup, with first-call reserves, at this moment, the Wisconsin team probably would line up like this:

Left End—Norb Esser, Madison senior and letterman, who played quite a bit in the Rose Bowl game and is especially well adapted to offense and defense chores. Co-captain Jerry Wuhrman, Milwaukee senior, because of his doubtful knee, and Freshman Bob Konovsky from Chicago, Ill., are the other best bets at this spot.

Left tackle—Stensby, Chicago junior and twice a letterman, has made the shift from guard without any trouble and this rugged competitor should be even better this year. Bill Miller, Whitewater senior and a junior "W" man from the 1951 squad, and Wells Gray, second semester sophomore from Loraine, Ohio, who was on the Rose Bowl squad, are the replacements.

Left Guard—Dixon, Wisconsin Dells senior whose linebacking ability was proven last year as a regular, has performed well at this spot, even though his previous offensive experience was reserve fullback. Bill Brandt, Appleton junior and a junior "W" man, is first replacement, the other is John F. Dittrich, a sophomore from Cudahy.

Center—Gary Messner, Madison junior and major letterman, has this job cinched so far and his spring final game performance was outstanding. He was a reserve linebacker last year. First replacement is Mike Cwayna, Sheboygan senior and twice a junior "W" winner, while two freshmen, David P. Dye of Toledo, Ohio, and William McNamara of Rockford, Ill., have the next call.

# AT THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN

Right Guard—Ron Roberts, rugged Chicago senior, whose determination and drive late last fall and this spring brought him to the top. Twice he has been a junior "W" winner and now he has arrived. Back of him are two more junior "W" men, Norm Amundsen, Chicago junior, and Don Pierce, Stillwater, Minn., junior.

Right Tackle—Mark Hoegh, major letterman and senior from Kaukauna, holds the edge over another major letterman, Wendell Gulseth, Madison senior, mainly because of his aggressiveness and speed. Gulseth was a reserve tackle and linebacker last year and handled most of the punting. A replacement is Don Ursin, Chicago junior and major letterman.

Right End—Ronnie Locklin, major letterman and junior from Appleton, has this position unless James Temp, another letterman and junior from LaCrosse can wrest it away from him. Both have height, speed, and good hands. What about Voss, well, he's listed but that knee may not let him play. If he's able, he'll start ahead of Locklin, for sure.

Quarterback—Jim Haluska, who came out of relative obscurity last fall as a sophomore to take over as quarterback, now rates as questionable. The Racine junior and major letterman, who set many school passing records, demonstrated ability on defense as a safety man, intercepting two passes in the spring game and running one of them back 58 yards to a touchdown. On defense, he was right up to par, completing 12 of 20 passes for 159 yards and one touchdown. Gust Vergetis, junior "W" man and Milwaukee senior, may start, mainly because of his understudying experience. Two sophomores, Jim Miller of Eau Claire and Jack Stellick, LaCrosse, are pretty good bets to give Vergetis a battle, as well as Glen Wilson, Milwaukee senior and twice a junior "W" winner.

Left Halfback—Roger Dornburg, Naperville, Ill., senior, twice a major letterman and co-captain, has the job right now. A regular linebacker on defense the past two years, his defensive work now is that of a halfback. While not speedy or tricky, he has tremendous power and is a good blocker. Ivy terms him a "football player, period!" . . . a real tribute. Harland Carl, the Greenwood senior and twice a major letterman, will figure in here if he can report for football, while a freshman, Dick Kolian, Oak Park, Ill., has a good chance, since he can punt with the best of them.

Right halfback—Jerry Witt, twice a major letterman at this position and a leading scorer each season, should rate the top call, although he will be given a battle by another senior, Tom Canny of Chicago. The Marshfield sprinter, however, should be a starter because of his scoring ability. A third contender could be Bob Gingrass of Iron Mountain, Mich., a junior "W" winner last fall.

Fullback—Alan Ameche, Kenosha junior and twice a letterman, to say nothing of record breaking ground-gaining feats for the Badgers, has the job but he's being pressed by a freshman from Evanston, Ill., one Charles Thomas, whose play in the spring game brought comments likening him as a junior edition of the Cleveland Brown's Marion Motley. Ameche was the hardest worker in the spring drills, was down to his playing weight of 205 pounds, and was dead serious in learning defensive chores as a linebacker. The big "Horse" looks set for another great year and the Badgers know they can rest him with a capable replacement. Another frosh, John Slauson from Braintree, Mass., and a Geneva, Ill., senior, Bob Lamphere (twice a junior "W" winner) are the other challengers.

Judging from the spring game, most writers concluded that Wisconsin appears to have a squad that will play hard, smart defensive football and one that can be pretty hard to handle on offense as long as Jim Haluska is healthy. It was doubted that any team could give Wisconsin a "plastering" for the Badgers seemed to have the confidence, poise, and know-how that are essential components for sound defensive play. Now, with Haluska's status in doubt, the \$64 question awaits the answer from the "right" quarterback.

# Beck Composes New Words for Famous 'On Wisconsin' Song

WISCONSIN SPIRIT is still an inspiration to Carl Beck, the man who in 1909 wrote the original words for "On, Wisconsin", famous collegiate marching song of the University of Wisconsin.

For Beck has written new words for the song that Badger students and alumni sing wherever they get together.

And the new words are considered to be as good or better than the originals, by those who should know—musicians and long-time loyal Badgers. The original words were primarily for use at Badger football games; the new words can be used at all kinds of occasions.

Here are the new lyrics for "On, Wisconsin"-

On, Wisconsin! On, Wisconsin! Stand up, Badgers, sing!
"Forward" is our driving spirit Loyal voices ring.
On, Wisconsin! On, Wisconsin! Raise her glowing flame!
Stand, Fellows, let us now Salute her name!

In a note accompanying the new words he sent to the University, Beck wrote:

"These new words are to meet numerous requests for words for possible use on occasions other than football, in connection with both state and University events. Instead of stringing out a lot of words, brevity, as in the original, is their aim, having swing and action in keeping with the music and title."

Beck, now an investment and public relations counselor in New York, first became a student at Wisconsin in 1908. In 1909 he stayed out of school to work in Chicago, earning money to further his education. It was in a boarding house there that he met William T. Purdy, genial Irishman who knew music.

Purdy had started to write the music for a song to be entered in a University of Minnesota song contest when Beck prevailed upon him to do the song for Wisconsin instead. So Purdy provided the music and Beck the words, and the famous "On, Wisconsin" was the result.

Beck could not get the time off from his job to bring the song to Madison, so in the fall of 1909, Purdy, armed with a bundle of songs and some letters of introduction to student friends of Beck's at Madison, came to the Wisconsin campus on the eve of the Wisconsin-Minnesota football game of that year.

The song was introduced at the pre-game rally of students and townspeople. It made an instant hit. Purdy sold the manuscript for the song for \$50 before his death in 1918. Beck returned to his University studies in 1911, was graduated, and was one of the founders of the Wisconsin Alumni club of New York.

Over the years the song continued to grow in popularity and is now considered among the foremost of American collegiate marching songs. Its music has been adopted by hundreds of high schools and colleges throughout the nation, to which each has written words to fit its own needs.

The need for "state" words, or words which would fit occasions other than football, has been recognized for "On, Wisconsin" many times in the past, and once in 1913 and again in 1927 such words were written, but they never stuck.

Singers constantly reverted to the original words, except for the line "run the ball clear 'round Chicago," for which the words "run the ball clear 'round Minnesota" or "run the ball clear down the field" were substituted after the University of Chicago dropped out of Big Ten football competition. When the song was originally written, Chicago was considered Wisconsin's greatest grid foe each year, the team the Badgers really had to defeat to have any sort of successful gridiron season.

## THE SEASON GAME BY GAME

WISCONSIN'S entrance into the Western Conference winner's circle at the close of the 1952 football season not only marked the end of 39 years of frustration but it was accomplished in typical Badger fashion—the hard way.

The Badgers earned their share of the Big Ten title with Purdue's Boilermakers. They had to pick themselves off the floor following an early season 23-14 setback at Ohio State, then fight off improving conference teams before finally engaging Minnesota's just-as-title-ambitious and healthy Gophers in the windum tussle.

Then, emotionally exhausted from the dramatics of the 21-21 deadlock with Minnesota, the Badgers had to sweat it out until the following Monday before learning that the Big Ten athletic directors had voted to send Wisconsin to the Rose Bowl.

Ever since 1912 when Wisconsin's last unbeaten team romped off with the Big Ten crown, the ensuing seasons have been earmarked with disappointments just when it appeared that a title pursuit might be climaxed with success.

Even so, the element of suspense from Nov. 22 to Nov. 24 this past season has no parallel in Wisconsin history.

Actually, the success story of this past season defines a solid coaching job by a solid coaching staff. Faced with replacing eight out of 11 defensive platoon starters (they were the best in the nation during 1951), five out of the 11 offensive starters, particularly in the quarterback spot, to say nothing of finding capable reserves, the Badger board of strategy came through handsomely.

Their job climaxed a four-year period under Ivy Williamson where each season the Wisconsin team was in Big Ten title and Rose Bowl contention right up to the final gun.

First indication of the coaching job being done was the almost overnight development of a quarterback. Ten days before the Marquette game, the coaches reached down into the junior varsity ranks and brought up a sophomore by the name of Jim Haluska who had caught on for fall drills only after a vacancy on the squad list.

Against Marquette, Haluska pitched three touchdown passes, completed 14 out of 21 attempts for 237 yards, besides calling all the plays except two as Wisconsin routed the Hilltoppers 42-19. The first TD pass was a toss to Harland Carl who romped away for an overall scoring gain of 53 yards. Another was a 13-yarder to Kent Peters in the end zone just seconds before the halftime horn while a third was a 44-yarder to Roger Dornburg. In addition, Haluska scored one on a quarterback sneak. Carl, meanwhile, added up two more TDs on scoring runs of 11 and 51 yards.

Badger coaches and fans worried over the fact that Marquette scored three times but the next game with Illinois dispelled some of the worries. The Badgers had prepared 11 months and 30 days for the Illini game, and they carried through to defeat Illinois 20-6.

Wisconsin completely controlled the game, scoring right after the opening kickoff with Alan Ameche and Harland Carl providing most of the impetus on slashing gains. Leading only 6-0 at halftime, the Badgers built up its margin to 20-0, one touchdown coming on a 36-yard pass from Haluska to Jerry Witt while Carl's 36 yard run set up the final score made by Ameche. Illinois got its only marker on a 63-yard kickoff return by End Jack Ryan,

The price of that victory was a setback at Ohio State. The Badgers failed to use five good scoring opportunities to advantage and the inspired Ohio State aggregation went on to a well-earned win 23-14. Wisconsin came from behind to lead 7-6 at halftime but failed to contain the Buckeye offensive in the third quarter, falling behind by a 20-7 margin. Wisconsin scored in the fourth quarter but the Bucks sewed it up with a field goal five minutes before the end.

At Iowa City, the next Saturday, Wisconsin found itself behind 7-0 at the outset but soon got rolling to down the Iowa Hawkeyes 42-13. Bill Hutchinson, replacing the injured Carl at left half, was the big gun rolling up 118 yards in 11 tries. Haluska completed 15 of 24 pass attempts for two touchdowns. Biggest feature of the game was Linebacker George O'Brien's punt which sailed 96 yards from the line of scrimmage, being downed on the Iowa 3. It was the first college game in which O'Brien ever punted and the distance is recorded as an American record.

Coming home, the Badgers next faced the strong UCLA team and until the final nine minutes of play, the score stood 7-7 and appeared likely to hold up. Then a pass interception combined with a 15-yard penalty gave the Bruins the ball on the Wisconsin 25. Paul Cameron then engineered the longest sustained drive of the game for UCLA, scoring in six plays, the final being a toss to Stits in the end zone. Later Stits intercepted a desperate Badger pass from the end zone and scampered 22 yards to a final touchdown, which gave UCLA a 20-7 victory.

At Houston, Texas, the next Saturday, Wisconsin began to roll again, with Alan Ameche showing real power for the first time in the season. The big full-back galloped for 116 yards to pace the 21-7 win over the Rice Owls. The Badgers built up a 21-0 lead by the middle of the third quarter and used reserves the rest of the way. The game was featured by the return of Wisconsin's regular punter, Wendy Gulseth, who averaged 48 yards including a tremendous punt of 85 yards.

Wisconsin's Homecoming game with Northwestern was a thriller and almost a tragedy. The Badgers rolled up and down the field with abandon in the first half, piling up a 21-7 lead as Ameche tramped through the line to eventually pile up 159 yards by rushing. Northwestern came back strong and only Paul Shwaiko's fourth quarter field goal gave Wisconsin the 24-20 win. Northwestern threatened to score at the close of the game but Wisconsin's defensive platoon came to the rescue throwing the passer for huge losses.

Down at Indiana, Wisconsin had a jittery third quarter but managed to pull itself together to earn a 37-14 victory over the Hoosiers. Ameche kept up his great rushing, getting 162 yards and scoring three touchdowns. He missed a fourth by fumbling near the goal line.

The Minnesota-Wisconsin closer at Camp Randall on Nov. 22 was a terrific spectators' game and apparently the 21-21 deadlock did justice to both teams. Minnesota was super-charged by the brilliant running, passing, pass receiving and punting of its All-American Paul Giel, while Ameche and Carl kept Wisconsin in there with brilliant running. The ball changed hands six times in the last three minutes of play, fumbles and pass interceptions ruining each team's desperate efforts to break the 21-21 tie.

Wisconsin thus ended its season with 6 wins, 2 losses, and 1 tie, including a 4-1-1 Big Ten record which earned a conference title share.

## WISCONSIN IN THE ROSE BOWL

WE have no alibis. We have no complaints. It was a good, tough game. Our boys gave a good account of themselves and I am proud of them."

Those were Coach Ivy Williamson's terse but calm remarks in a grilling press conference minutes after the Rose Bowl game which ended with Southern

California winning from Wisconsin 7-0.

For the thousands of Badgers who saw the New Year's Day football classic at Pasadena, and for the millions of Big Ten rooters who viewed the contest on television or heard the radio reports, Williamson's first statements expressed their feelings, too, even though it was natural to be keenly disappointed.

The Badgers entered the game a one-touchdown underdog and the game actually came out that way. But more than that the bulldog determination of the Badgers to upset the odds against them was a con-

stant thrill.

The Badgers played up to their ability, probably played their best game of the season, but, at any rate, demonstrated their best defensive ability. And, right down to the last 24 seconds of the game. they had the 101,500 Rose Bowl spectators on the edge of the seats.

Not once during the second half did Wisconsin punt. It gained 211 yards by rushing and 142 by passing, as compared to Southern California's 48 yards by ground and 185 by air. And five times Wisconsin was on the threshold of touchdown territory only to see the opportunities fade by inches or by pass interceptions.

Early in the game, Wisconsin had fourth down and two to go on the USC 14 but the Trojans stopped Fullback Alan Ameche just short of the necessary

yardage to end the first Badger threat.

At the start of the second half, Ameche electrified the crowd by dashing 54 yards on the first play, being caught from behind on the Trojan 33. But this threat died on the USC 27 with a fumble by Roy Burks,

From this point, Southern California moved 73 yards in nine plays to score the only touchdown of the game, the payoff coming on a nifty 22 yard pass from Bukich to Carmichael.

Wisconsin countered immediately with t drive from its 14 yard line to the Trojan seven. Then, with fourth down and six to go, the Badgers tried a fake placekick, with Jerry Witt carrying the ball wide to the left. Witt was stopped inches short of a first down.

After Southern California had staged a march of its own, the Badgers again were on the prowl, this time moving to the USC 15 before the opportunity wts lost.

Here USC's great kicker, Des Koch, set a Rose Bowl record by booting a low, spiral 88 yards downfield to the Wisconsin 12 where it was finally picked up and returned five yards by Paul Schwaiko. The official measurement (from scrimmage line) set 73 yards as the distance of the kick.

But, in spite of this great kick and the shortage of time (only four minutes remained) Wisconsin fought btck. The Badgers moved down until they reached the USC 24 with first down coming up and less than 90 seconds remaining. On the second play, Harland Carl raced into the end zone, just got his hands on Jim Haluska's long pass but stumbled and fell out of bounds, dropping the ball as he careened into the stands. Two more plays failed and Southern Californit held the ball for the remaining seconds.





# History of Camp Randall Stadium

THEY CALL it Camp Randall.

That's important.

Every now and then some hurried out-of-town sports announcer will call it "Randall Field," but he

is corrected quickly.

The University of Wisconsin is proud that its sports center is more than just an athletic field-and that the drama and excitement of football seasons are set against a backdrop of colorful Wisconsin history.

In its 60 years of ownership, the university has expanded the facilities there until they include a large stadium, fieldhouse, baseball diamond, room for other

sports, and trailer camps.

But the university didn't name it. The name was decided long before that by veterans of the Civil war who knew it was a great military camp named for a wartime governor. When the university took it over, they insisted that the name be preserved forever as a memorial to their fallen friends.

In the days before the Civil war, the site was owned by the State Agricultural society whose yearly state fairs attracted holidaying throngs there. With the outbreak of the war, however, the society turned the place over to the government to become the state's major training center.

The display halls were transformed into white-washed barracks and the hall used for flower shows became a hospital. A total of 70,000 troops was drilled —usually about 7,000 being stationed there at a time and 500,000 relatives and friends came to visit them.

Later in the war part of the camp became a prison where a group of sick Confederates, captured by Gen. Pope at Island No. 10 in the Mississippi, was brought.

Many died in the drafty prison hospital on the knoll and were buried in what is now Confederate Rest at Forest Hill cemetery.

The land again became the state fair grounds when peace returned and when Gen. U. S. Grant visited it 15 years later he hailed the transformation as "a symbol of beating the spears of war into the plow-shares of peace."

Other visitors to the grounds were Gens. Sherman and Sheridan and Pres. Hayes and when the state fair was moved to Milwaukee and a few years later even the Dane County Agricultural society stopped using

it for fairs, the Civil war veterans were furious to learn the land was to be sold for building lots.

Blasting the "sordid sacrilege," they urged the

legislature to buy it and in 1893 the state presented it to the university as a memorial athletic field.

When the question of a name arose, the veter-ans promptly carried the day for "camp" instead of "field."

Intercollegiate athletics had been started at Wisconsin in 1881 and the university had had a football team since 1889. The school won its first great victory in 1894, defeating Minnesota 6 to 0 in a game on the lower campus that part of the crowd watched from fringed surreys. The great teams of '96, '97, and '01 were among the first to play at the new field.

Charles Van Hise, who became president of the university in 1903, was a sports enthusiast as well as a great president and he used to ride his horse nightly out to watch the football practice. Games were played before the old wood fairstand and many Madi-

son business and professional men still boast of the holes they found as boys to insure a free look at the

The university had a "real" stadium by 1913 but its stands were still wooden. The legislature declined to pay for concrete—and consequently, was promptly blamed when a large section collapsed nov. 21, 1915, at the climactic Wisconsin-Minnesota game.

Twenty people were injured, some seriously, and only the fact that the seats fell slowly prevented more

casualties among the 1,800 in the area.

So in 1917 the present stadium—completed only in 1951—was started with a grant of \$15,000 from the legislature. The rest of the money was earned by athletic events and the stadium, which seats 51,000, is the only one in the Big Ten to "pay its own way"

that way. Permanent dormitories were built, housing 150 men but this space now is used as athletic department offices and training quar-

ters.

The fieldhouse at the open end of the stadium horseshoe was built in 1930 for almost \$500,000 and has room for about 15,000. In addition to basketball and boxing events, it is the site of the university's commencement ceremonies.




