Monday, March 1, 1937, 4 P.M.

Held in the office of Regent Wilkie

PRESENT: Regents Callahan, Gates, Wilkie; Dean Fred, Business Manager Phillips, Secretary McCaffrey.

Professor Oliver Rundell was present to discuss the matter of the University Club which was considered at the last Board meeting.
