These Extracts are carefully manufactured *in vacuo*, and afford an elegant and reliable method of administering the various medicines. They all contain about 20 per cent. of Alcohol, as a means of preservation. When the nature of the drug is resinous or oily, the proportion of alcohol is increased sufficiently to secure the solution of these bodies.

The Extracts, which are official, are made to conform in strength to the U. S. Pharmacopœia. In the others, each fluid pound of Extract, represents one pound of the raw material.

Sugar and flavoring oils, are omitted in all the Extracts: the addition of these, being left to the judgment of the physician.

The Extracts are all neatly put up in bottles, containing one-fourth and one-half pound.—Vide American Journal of Pharmacy, vol. 28, page 88.

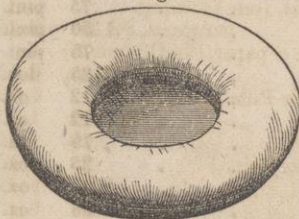

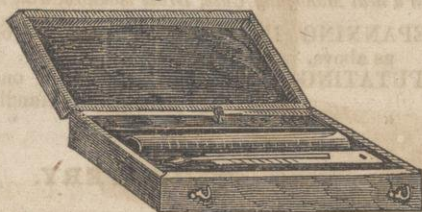

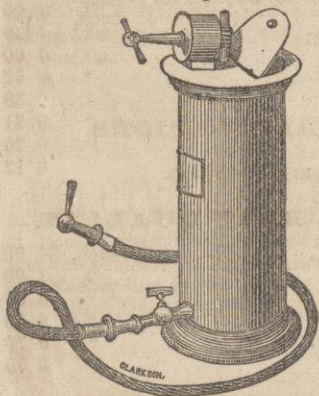
